PRIZES: Entry Fees divided 50% to Club and 50% to Prize Pool. Winner - 75% of Prize Pool, Runner-Up - 25% of Prize Pool, 3rd Place – Ribbon

ENTRY FEES: Are to be paid in Canadian funds by cash, cheque or money order payable to the BCABPC. U.S. participants please purchase bank drafts or money orders in Canadian funds. Your co-operation is appreciated, thank you. The Field Trial Secretary will acknowledge the receipt of electronically transmitted entries. All entry forms are to be completed and in the hands of the Field Trial Secretary and entry fees paid in full prior to the running of a dog. The tendering of NSF cheques or cheques postdated beyond the closing date shall be considered as non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque.

“Post Entries” may be accepted on the day of the Trial, with an additional fee of \$50.

* **Listing Fee:** A listing fee of **\$8.82** as established by the CKC must accompany the entry of a dog for which a CKC Individual Registration Number, Event Registration Number (ERN), Performance Event Number (PEN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) is not shown on the entry form.

Entries close at 7:00 pm Monday, August 18, 2014 and the draw will be held immediately after the close at 27505 – 31A Avenue, Aldergrove, BC

RUNNING & HANDLING: Horseback handling is optional. If one handler is mounted and the other is walking, the judges shall set a reasonable pace. Mounted handlers must keep their horse in a walk unless otherwise authorized by the judge.

COURSES & BIRDS: The trial will be run on a single course. Depending on course conditions, the Field Trial Committee may adjust the course, including the addition of a bird field, to suit. All dogs with bird work will be shot over with blank cartridges on game contact. Released birds will be chukar. Any dog encountering native game birds on the course must point and be shot over.

HORSES: Handler's horses will not be provided by the club, however corrals may be. Water may be available on site. Handlers will be responsible for making their own arrangements. The trial will not be held up waiting for horses at the line.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Princeton has hotels that accept dogs. There will be space for campers and horse trailers at the site. Rather than a Stake-Out Fee, donations will be accepted at the Saturday potluck with all funds going to the landowner.

SITE RULES: BCABPC is grateful to Jura Stock Ranch for the use of these grounds. Please respect and abide by all good neighbor rules. Please clean up all garbage before leaving, no matter how small and make an effort to leave the grounds cleaner than you found them. Spread all manure and waste hay and fill in dog holes.

NO SMOKING OR OPEN FLAME IS PERMITTED OUTSIDE OF YOUR VEHICLE. THIS AREA IS EXTREMELY DRY AND SENSITIVE TO THE SMALLEST SPARK. PLEASE RESPECT THE LANDOWNERS' WISH AND ABIDE BY THIS RULE.

HOSPITALITY: Pot Luck dinner will be held on Saturday evening in the Maverick Saloon.

CANADIAN-RESIDENT ENTRANTS THAT ARE NOT CKC MEMBERS: Effective January 1, 2011, the Canadian Kennel Club has implemented an annual non-CKC-member participation fee. Canadian-resident owners who are not members of the CKC must pay this annual participation fee or join the CKC. Failure to do so will result in cancellation of awards and titles. For co-owned dogs, one of the owners must supply a CKC membership number or pay the fee/join CKC. The above applies only to Canadian residents; American-owned dogs are exempt. The trial secretary will have some of the forms available at the trial; it is the entrants' responsibility to submit the form and fee to CKC.

BORDER CROSSING: A rabies certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada and the USA. Government regulations require a valid Rabies Certificate dated at least 30 days prior to entry into Canada. Please note that border crossings now involve more thorough inspection of vehicles, dogs and papers. Proof of citizenship is required for entry into Canada and return to the USA. Please carry a Passport, naturalization papers, etc. as proof of citizenship. You can borrow a starter pistol if you decide not to bring one across the border.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- The BCABPC wishes to remind all participants and spectators that there will be no **exercising or training** of any dogs on the grounds 30 days before the trial, during or after the trial without the permission of the Field Trial Chairman or Field Trial Secretary.
- The duty of having a **dog ready in place when required** for judging rests solely with its handler or owner. If a dog is not present at the place where it is to start within 5 minutes after it is called for by the judges to run, it must be disqualified. The judges are responsible for keeping the time.
- **Blank pistols** only will be fired over all dogs with bird work in senior and derby stakes. Blank pistols may be fired over puppies if both handlers agree. No live ammunition will be allowed in any stake. Pistols must have solid barrels and be a minimum of **not less than .32 cal. or equivalent** (example 209 primers).
- No dog shall be **picked up** during a trial except with permission from the judge.
- All participants must be familiar with the **CKC Rules** and also the rules and provisions of this Premium List. CKC Field Trial Rulebooks are available from the CKC or online at the CKC website for CKC members.
- The Canadian Chukar Championship stake is 45 minutes in length.
- **Collaring** a dog away after game contact will be allowed.
- **Backing tests:** If a dog has placed in one of the senior stakes of the trial and needs only a backing test to complete the requirements for a Championship, the owner may request a backing test. This test will be allowed at the discretion of the Field Trial Chairman and will depend on availability of birds. The test will cost \$20.00
- **Tracking collars:** Approved electronic tracking collars may be used. Any questions regarding their use should be referred to the Field Trial Chairman and also to the Judges.
- **Bitches in season** may run at the end if they are entered in the last stake of the day.

CKC, Chapter 16: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge is not subject to indignities. The Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

LIABILITY: All entries for this Field Trial are accepted on condition that the BCABPC, its officials and members, land and horse owners, are released from all liabilities for loss, damage or injury sustained by dog, horse or person in conjunction with, or during the running of, this Field Trial. All minors shall be under the direct care and supervision of the parent or guardian.

DIRECTIONS TO JURA STOCK RANCH

Take Highway #3 into Princeton (from either east or west) and turn towards town onto Bridge Street (Petro-Canada station on the corner). Immediately turn right onto Highway #5A. Take Highway #5A over the steel bridge and just around the curve up the hill, turn right on Old Hedly Road.

If coming across the US border in western Washington, take the Sumas/Huntington crossing. This crossing will take you directly to Highway #1 eastbound. Once you get to Hope (about 1 to 1 ½ hours) you will see the sign for Highway #3 which goes off to the right.

If crossing in eastern Washington take the Oroville/Osoyoos crossing and proceed north on Highway #97 until you reach Highway #3 and turn west (left).

If you are coming into Princeton from Highway #5A north (Merrite, etc.) stay on it until there is a turn to the left just as you come over the hill into town (a marker is the road sign warning of a change to speed of 70 km/hr.). Turn left onto Old Hedley Road.

From Old Hedley Road, quite quickly you will turn left onto the Princeton/Summerland Road (also known as Osprey Lake Road). Drive past the fair grounds and stay on that same road for approximately 7 km. You will pass Belfort Road on your left and then the road bends to the right. You will see a sign on your right for Jura Stock Ranch/Maverick Saloon. Turn right into the driveway and you are there!
