RULES GOVERNING THESE TRIALS

BC Cocker Spaniel Club reserves the right to remove any person from this sanction match. The trial chairperson shall have full control of this event which will be governed by the Canadian Kennel Club rules. The obedience trials chairperson shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation and the discipline committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

No entry fee will be refunded if the trials cannot open or be completed by reason of riot, civil disturbance, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the club.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities.

The trial committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, loss or other misfortune to dogs, exhibitors or patrons.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children during these trials.

The owner of a dog entered in these trials is entirely responsible for any error in entering their dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

Only dogs entered in the regular classes or for exhibition only are allowed within the precincts of these obedience trials. Dogs entered in the Open or Utility classes must have a CKC individual registration number or a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) or a CKC Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN)

Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct and actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds. All dogs must be kept on leash with the exception of exhibiting in the obedience rings.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs, inside and outside the buildings. Dogs are to be exercised in designated areas only.

Any dog excused by the trials Chairperson or a Veterinarian for any reason, shall not compete in any class for any award for the balance of these trials.

The entry form must be complete in every respect. Exhibitors must abide by any errors made in entering their dog.

In case of a substitute or overload judge change, an exhibitor may enter a dog under the replacement judge providing that the dog is entered in one of the regular classes of a show being held at the same venue by the same club and has been assigned a competition number. A new number along with the accompanying fees will be accepted by the Show Secretary up to one hour prior to the start of the show.

Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of entry fees shall be considered non-payment, and is an offence punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards (CH. 16, SEC 3, Dog Show Rules)

Bitches in season may not compete. Full refunds will be given for dogs withdrawn because of injury, illness or death and for bitches in season, if notification in writing is accompanied by a Veterinarian's Certificate. All refunds must be requested in writing and once the catalogue has been printed, will have the CKC event fees and listing fees, if applicable, deducted.

Any person either within or outside the judging ring, who does anything calculated to attract or distract or otherwise affect in any way, the attention deportment or performance of a dog under judgement, may be disciplined by the Discipline Committee in whatever way it considers in the best interests of the CKCSCBC, or the judge may take summary action

The precincts of these trials are the enclosed area of Cedarbrook Stables.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Novice A: For dogs which have not won a CD (Companion Dog) in any country. One dog only may be entered in these classes by any one exhibitor and every dog must be exhibited by the owner or member of the immediate family. No trainer or person who previously exhibited a dog through its UD title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to compete. When a dog is wrongfully entered in either class any score awarded will be cancelled and any trophies must be returned.

Novice B: For dogs which have not won a CD in Canada. Dogs may be handled or exhibited by owner or any other person. For sit and down exercises each dog must have a separate handler.

Open A: For dogs which have earned the title CD in Canada but have not yet earned the title CDX (Companion Dog Excellent). One dog only may be entered in these classes by any one exhibitor and every dog must be exhibited by the owner or member of the immediate family. No trainer or person who previously exhibited a dog through its UD title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to compete. When a dog is wrongfully entered in either class any score awarded will be cancelled and any trophies must be returned.

Open B: For dogs which have earned the title CD in Canada. A dog may continue to compete in this class after winning the title CDX and / or Utility. For sit and down exercises each dog must have a separate handler.

Utility: For dogs which have won the title CDX in Canada. A dog may continue to compete in this class after winning the title UD (Utility Dog).

TRANSITION CLASSES

Pre-Novice: For dogs which have not won a PCD (Pre-Companion Dog) title in Canada or a comparable title in any country.
