I have bred German Shorthaired Pointers under the Thomashenry prefix since 1980. Our kennel has had number one GSP 1986, 1988, 1990, 1991 and 1996 with several in the top three in the sporting group in other years.

We have had the top winning GSP / number one Sporting Dog & number three all breeds in South America as well as the first GSP ever to win the group at the World show in 1992. A Thomashenry dog was Best of Winners at the American National Specialty in 2000. We have champions in six countries.

I have also bred English Springer Spaniels and grew up with Irish Water Spaniels. We currently have Labrador Retrievers and our Dachshunds have placed in the top five many years including number one, boasting Best in Shows and Best in Specialty shows.

I am CKC licensed to judge all breeds. I have judged Sporting, Working and Hound Specialties , and Nationals, in both Canada , the USA, Australia, Japan and New Zealand and have also judged in Iceland , Hong Kong, Indonesia , Chile ,Colombia and Manila.

My wife and I have been breeding and exhibiting under the Lotus prefix since the early nineties. We have bred numerous American and Canadian Champions as well as Group, Specialty and Best in Show winners. Our first breed was shih-tzu and currently we breed and exhibit pekingese.

In 2002 we acquired our first Pekingese. The breed was always close to my heart and the opportunity to own and show my first was a thrill. Shortly afterwards I was honored with the opportunity to go into partnership with R. William Taylor and the late Nigel Aubrey-Jones of the St. Aubrey Elsdon Pekingese.

The latest Pekingese to be campaigned was BIS BISS A/C Ch. St. Aubrey Niklaus of Elsdon. He was Canada's Top Dog of All Breeds for 2011. To be the breeders of Canada's Top Dog is the dream of a lifetime. We continue to breed and show on a very limited scale as we have always felt that selective breeding can consistently produce quality.

Niklaus' grandsire was the great Multi BIS BISS A/C Ch. St. Aubrey Jubilation of Elsdon. "Bobby" was bred by R. William Taylor and campaigned in partnership with Dawne Deeley. He remains Canada's All time Top Best in Show winning Pekingese and All time Top Best in Show winning Toy. To have owner handled "Bobby" to his very first Best in Show will always remain a very special memory.

I have been involved in judging since 2007 and started with the Toy group. I am now licensed to judge all Toys, all Non Sporting dogs and am currently on permit for the remainder of the Sporting Group. To have been asked to judge Sweeps at the Pekingese Club of America and the Canadian Shih Tzu Club National Specialties early on is what I believe gave me the nudge not to mention the bug to get into judging.

Every assignment and every moment in the ring for me is anticipation of finding that truly special example of it's breed. As a breeder this was what always motivated and inspired me to truly present the best I had to offer to the fancy.
