Thunderbird Equestrian Show Park – 24550 – 72nd Avenue Langley, BC



Driving Directions:

Coming from the West (LM, VI)

Head east on HWY 1

Take Exit 66 for 232 Street N toward Fort Langley (north)

Enter roundabout take 1st exit onto 72nd Avenue

Continue on 72 Avenue 3.5 km – to 248th Street, turn right, then look for entrance to park on right

Driving Directions:

Coming from the East (Interior)

Head west on HWY 1.

Take Exit 66 for 232 Street toward Fort Langley (north)

Enter roundabout take 1st exit onto 72nd Avenue

Continue on 72 Avenue 3.5 km – to 248th Street - turn right, then watch for entrance to park on right

SOCIAL HOUR:

Join us Friday after the steeplechase events are complete (approximately 4:30 pm), at the volunteer/refreshment area and meet the judges. Regional courses will have already been drawn (so that course building can continue as events finish) but a list of the courses and the designing judges will be posted. Alcohol and cold refreshments will be available for purchase.

SATURDAY (approximately 5 pm):

The individual placement ribbons will be announced and the bar will be serving refreshments.

COMPETITION DAYS - CONCESSION:

Food trucks being organized.

SECURITY: A wristband will be required for the competitor's patrolled crating area and crating barn. There will be security on site overnight around the competition rings and designated crating area. However, we must stress - **competitor's property on site is left at their own risk.**

SHADE TENT/CRATING AREA: Pre-arranged crating is available in two designated areas – outdoors, sand ring to the west of the Regular ring and horse stalls in the barn to the south of the Regular ring. Because of the number of entrances and the ease of climbing the fence, there will not be a monitored security **entrance** into the area outdoor crating ring. However, we will be providing marked security personnel to patrol the crating areas/isles. There is unsecure crating in various areas in the grass around competition rings. Competitors must provide their own shade tents. Please go to the website for instructions/reserving outdoor arena spots or barn stalls. The horse stall fee is what Thunderbird charges us.

VENDORS: There shall be NO unauthorized vending at this event, including competitors from their shade tents or crating stalls. Please contact Joanie-Leigh at agileted@gmail.com for vending/booth information.

ACCOMODATIONS

Unfortunately we were unable to come to a reasonable group booking agreement with any of the nearby hotels. However, there are quite a number of pet friendly hotels in Langley and you can consider Abbotsford or Maple Ridge. Just google pet friendly hotels. We also have started a list of people willing to billet other competitors on the BC Yukon facebook page (@BCYRegionals – see March 3 posting) If you would like to put your name on this list as a host or if you are looking for a place to lay your head during regionals check out the post.

Sandman is still accepting dogs but the price is \$80-100 more than last year with only the first 2 dogs included – after that \$20 per dog per day

THUNDERBIRD EQUESTRIAN SHOW PARK RV'ing (ONSITE)

Want to stay close to the action? Have a potluck with your friends??

There are 65 RV spots with water and electricity hook ups and almost unlimited self-contained spots available for booking at the Regionals. All spots have available wifi connections. There will be no sani dump at the show park (but several in the area along Hwy 1).

Reservations for the RV spots will be done through your premium reservation form – please do not contact Thunderbird directly.

CAMPING:

ELIGIBILITY

- All dogs that have an ID# with AAC are eligible to compete at the Provincial level. The event is open to all dogs capable of demonstrating the elements of agility, control and the mental and physical ability to carry out the required tests. Competitors, through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the rules and regulations of AAC.
- Dogs less than 18 months of age, bitches in season or in an advanced state of pregnancy, or dogs suffering from any injury or illness that affect the dog's physical or mental performance, and any dog which demonstrates signs of aggression towards people or other dogs shall not be permitted to compete in a Regional Agility Championships.
- Regional Championships Applicants must supply AAC ID# on their entry form. Regional Championships are subject to all AAC rules and regulations except where indicated in the Regional and National Rules and Guidelines. All current members of AAC must receive a discount on their Regional entry fee compared to the entry fee for non-members
- Safety at this event shall be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers through submissions of entry at this event shall take full responsibility for themselves, and the actions of their children and their dogs. No leads, collars, food or toys shall be permitted in the ring during the Regional Saturday and Sunday events as per AAC rules. Food and toys will be allowed during the warm up runs on Friday ONLY, and under the following conditions:
 - that allowing food does not contravene the site and/or facility rules
 - toys should be in a good state of repair
 - toys may not contain audible squeakers or noise makers
 - handlers are permitted to throw toys to the dog or tug with their dog
 - training aids (e.g. clickers, stride regulators, target plates) are not allowed
 - food may not be thrown on the ground, or to the dog, it may only be fed from the hand or container
- No entry fee will be refunded if the Event cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of god, public emergency, strike, thunder and lightning or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers.
- Dogs must remain on leash and under control at ALL times when not competing or warming up or in designated off-leash areas. Dogs must not be left unattended except in the designated kennelling area and your dog(s) must be properly secured. Dogs must be exercised in the designated areas only. You must pick up after your dog on the show grounds and at your hotel/motel. Anyone found not picking up will be excused from the trial site with NO refund of entry.
- All dogs must run at a jump height at which they would be eligible to compete in an AAC-sanctioned trial for the class in which they are competing, to a maximum of 24" in regular classes and a maximum of 20" in specials and veterans classes.
- Competitors shall have the right to video tape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portions of this event may be taped for commercial purposes without the permission of the AAC.

FRIDAY EVENTS

FRIDAY: WARM UP GAMES

A great way to familiarize your dog with the equipment and the outdoors trial rings!!

Open ring format, with no judge, you will be timed: 70 seconds max. You can run the suggested course or practice any particular piece/pieces of equipment. Courses will be designed without jumps – lots of contacts, weaves and tunnels – one warm up ring will be designated Spec/Vets and the other Regular. You may purchase as many warm up rounds as you wish (\$8 per run) – warm up tickets will be in your check in/registration package - where you use those tickets will be up to you but the aframe height will remain at 5 ft in the Spec/Vet ring and 5'6" ft in the Regular ring. AAC is now allowing food and toys during warm up rounds ONLY and the rules are very specific:

- that allowing food does not contravene the site and/or facility rules
- toys should be in a good state of repair
- toys may not contain audible squeakers or noise makers
- handlers are permitted to throw toys to the dog or tug with their dog
- training aids (e.g. clickers, stride regulators, target plates) are not allowed
- food may not be thrown on the ground, or to the dog, it may only be fed from the hand or container

Please be considerate when feeding your dog in the ring during warm ups – it maybe your run that is affected the next day, if you are careless with your treats!



STEEPLECHASE ROUNDS (AAC Sanctioned)

There will be two walk-throughs and start times (morning and afternoon - both steeplechase) to allow travelers to compete in the steeplechase rounds.

Any dog with AAC# can enter. Dog does not have to be entered in the Regional events to participate in these rounds. You can register your dog(s) for AAC Steeplechase runs on the Regional entry form

- Each Steeplechase run is \$18 each to enter
- Both Steeplechase runs are open to anyone who meets AAC eligibility requirements (the dog does not have to be entered into the BCY 2018 Regional Competition to enter the Steeplechase events).
- You will be able to earn an AAC Qualifying score in each class, based on AAC sanctioned rules for Steeplechase events
- Placement and Qualifier ribbons will be awarded

Each Regional will consist of 6 qualifying runs, which shall include; 2 standards, 2 Gamblers and 2 jumpers courses. Dogs must be entered and run all 6 classes to be eligible to place in the Regional Championships. All dogs not having a fully signed ID card shall be measured in on the first day of the event by the officiating Judge(s) and this measurement shall not be used on their ID card. A person may enter more than one dog but under no circumstances may more than one person enter the same dog. Dogs shall run every round, there will be no dismissing of dogs except for aggression, elimination in the ring, leaving the ring, un-sportsman like behaviour or dogs out of control.

REGIONALS RULES (Abbreviated version)

<http://aac.ca/en/regional-rules> (please review the Regional Rules documents as posted online – below is **ONLY** a few rules of note) – it is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with AAC Regional Rules for competition at this event.

The Agility Association of Canada's Regional Championships are a prestigious event unto themselves and a steppingstone to the AAC National Championships. Dogs must qualify at their Regional Championships to be eligible to enter the AAC National Competition.

JUDGING RULES

For standard/jumpers rounds the following modifications to the existing AAC Rules for scoring a Master Standard/Jumpers rounds apply:

- Three refusals will not result in elimination (all refusals 5 faults no max.)
- Wrong Course will not result in elimination (all instances 20 faults no max.)
- Non-completion will not result in elimination (all instances 20 faults no max.)
- Elimination or dismissal will result in dog not scoring any points for that event.
- Competitors that do not run in an event will score no points for that event
- If a handler intentionally directs a dog to repeat an obstacle, the run will score no points and the dog and handler must leave the course at standard course time

For Gambler Rounds, judged at Masters Gamblers rules, except:

- All wrong/off courses after the closing gamble has begun (after the first gamble obstacle has been attempted) will be recorded as a failure to complete the final gamble.
- There will be no refusals called in either mini gambles or final gamble.
- If a dog takes two gamble obstacles in sequential order in the opening sequence the judge shall blow the whistle and the competitor shall retain all opening points up to that time.
- If the handler purposely touches the dog as a form of encouragement or reward in the opening sequence, the run instantly becomes an FEO run and scores zero points.
- The judge may inform the handler that the signal to start the closing gamble has sounded and the handler must attempt the closing gamble to retain points. They may still attempt the closing gamble after final signal (indicating allotted gamble time is up) in order to retain opening points.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Rosettes and Trophies for the Regional will be awarded to the Regional Champions. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place in each category and jump height for each of the 6 Regional events, as well as Qualifying ribbons for those teams that earn 350pts. Saturday's individual placements will be handed out after events are complete. Ribbons from Saturday may be picked up on Sunday. An overall Regional Champion for each 4", 8", 12", 16", 20" and 24" category (Regular, Specials, Veterans and Double Drop Vets) will be awarded.

DOUBLE DROP VETS:

PLEASE - If you do not know if your dog is a double drop vet, ask an agility judge! If your dog is now jumping two jump heights below what would be his REGULAR jump height – your dog is DD vet. It doesn't matter if your dog immediately started in Specials then later went down only one jump height to vets, your dog is a DD vet.

SUNDAY EVENT



The ever-exciting and so popular!!!!

Either you are in it or watching with a bevy from the best ringside seating!

After all the Sunday regional events are complete, and we await the cumulative scores/placement results, the BCY 2018 Regionals Committee will host a Steeplechase Run-Off (non-sanctioned) based on the results from the two steeplechase events on Friday. To qualify for the money round on Sunday, you need to finish in the top 2 of your class of either of Friday's courses, whether you qualified for AAC purposes or not. If you finish in the top 2 in both Friday's runs, you still only get one chance to run on Sunday, but you have reduced the number of competitors you will be running against by keeping another dog out of that spot. There are potentially 4 competition spots in each of the 15 jump heights.

Each height and division will have their own cash jackpot based on the number of entries in the two Friday Steeplechase events. There will be no combining of heights or divisions.

There is no fee to enter the run-off round (but it is only open to those who are invited to run based on Friday's results). Qualifiers list for the Sunday event will be posted Sunday morning in the results area along with the jackpot amounts for each runoff. The K-9 Cliffhangers will be donating the net proceeds from the Friday Steeplechase events to the cash jackpots.

AAC passed the following motion:

MOVED By Seanna O'Neill seconded by Cindy Swiney, that when cash prizes are going to be awarded at any AAC event, (including Regional/National event), the actual amounts of the cash award and/or percentage of entry money to be put toward the cash awards must be outlined in the premium list, along with how the cash awards will be distributed among the various heights and/or divisions.

In order to satisfy this rule, the committee **guarantees** that there will be a **minimum** of \$25 per jump height awarded to the steeplechase run off champion for that height division (with at least 14 or more runs in that height division on Friday) . Any steeplechase run off champion in a height division with 13 or less runs in the two steeplechase events held on Friday will be guaranteed a **minimum** jackpot of \$5. Past history leads us to believe the jackpots MAY BE higher, but until registration is complete and net proceeds are calculated this is declaration meets the requirement of the motion. At time of printing we have not secured a PRIZE sponsor, but you will hear about if we do!

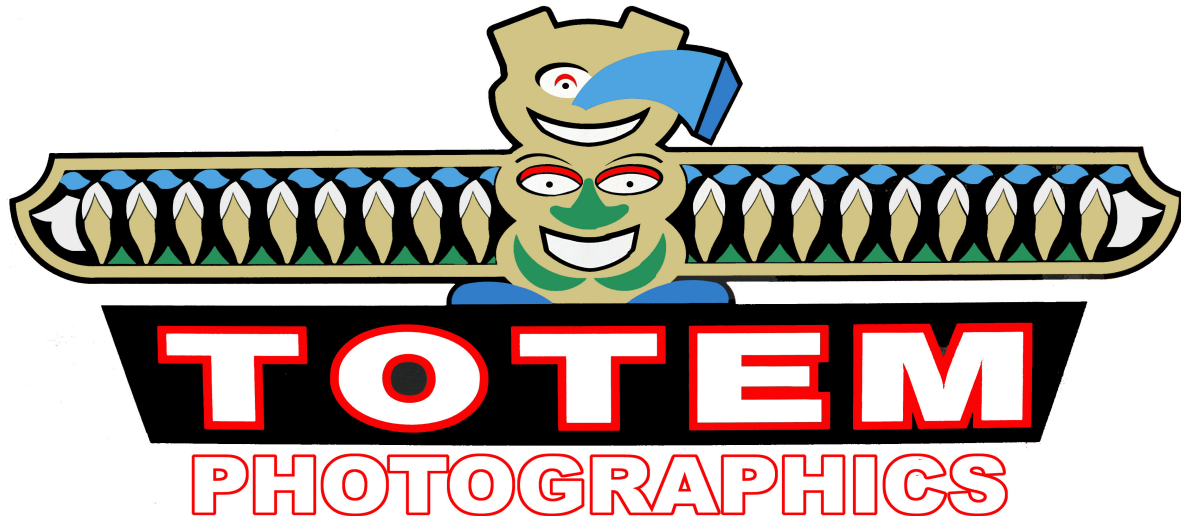
