Presents The Correct Use of Electronic Collars in Obedience and Field Training

A one workshop with Anne Everett March 8, 2014

Welcome to a 1 day workshop focused on the use of electronic collars in obedience and field work. During this workshop you will learn how to effectively and humanely use an electronic collar as part of your training program. The day will begin with a session on how to fit the e-collar and discovering what level of stimulation is appropriate for your dog. We will then discuss the theory behind the use of e-collars, as well as their misuse. The balance of the workshop will be devoted to teaching you the trainer the appropriate use of the e-collar.

A number of obedience and field exercises will be covered. You will have the opportunity to participate in each session, based on the level of understanding your dog has of the obedience or field skill that is the focus of that particular session. For example, your dog must understand the fetch command before that command is reinforced with the e-collar.

This workshop is registrant driven, so please do not hesitate to ask for clarification, or for a particular session to be repeated if you are unsure about methodology.

Anne Everett has been involved with the CKC hunt test program since its inception. She is qualified to judge at all levels of hunt tests, field trials, as well as HRC hunts. Anne has earned over 100 Master passes on 12 different dogs, 6 UKC HRCH's, and 6 UKC UH's. She has also earned Qualifying wins, as well as Open and Junior field trial placements with her dogs. She has titled 4 Grand Master Hunters in Canada, as well as 10 Master Hunters and a number of Junior and Senior dogs. Anne has also earned CKC OTCH titles on two dogs and has numerous High in Trials in the obedience ring. She earned the first OTCH-MH title combination on a Golden Retriever in Canada.

The workshop will be held at Heads Up Kennels in Merville, BC on March 8, 2014. The majority of this workshop will be held indoors in a heated facility. Participants will be limited to 10 working handlers. 2 dog per handler limit. The cost for the workshop is \$125 for a working spot. Registration closes when the workshop fills. No refunds after Mar 1. Information on local accommodation and directions to the workshop will be sent out with your confirmation of registration.

This is a working clinic. Bring your dog, lunch, a chair, a walkie-talkie, an umbrella, raingear and shade for your dog. Parking and airing areas will be available on the kennel grounds.
