In consideration of the acceptance of entries made in these all-breed shows, obedience trials, agility trials or any of the associated Specialties, and of the holding of these shows and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Northern Alberta Canine Association and associated Specialty Clubs, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, or show secretaries, and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, daath or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog by the negligence of the Club(s) or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in these shows and trials, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

JEAN-LOUIS BLAIS – Madeleine and I are parents of three children and grand parents of two grand children. Madeleine is a retired teacher at elementary school and I am a retired psychologist.

We have bred Labrador Retrievers for over 30 years in St-Gilles, Quebec, the French Province of Canada. We have been very active in breeding and showing our Labradors with great success; mostly through Canadian and American Labrador Specialties. We have done also some obedience and working titles. We have finished over 100 Canadian Champions, around 20 American Champions (all Specialty Winners) and we have Champions in many other countries.

During the last fifteen years I have been invited by many Labrador Retriever Clubs both in the USA and in Canada to judge their puppies and veterans sweepstakes. I am now a regular judge for the Sporting and the Working Groups. I was particularly honoured to judge the Labrador Retriever Club of Canada National in August 2009. I have also judged in USA many times, in Mexico and recently in Brazil and in the Philippines.

KRISTEN FRANCIS – I was literally born into the dog world of showing and breeding dogs as my mother bred Doberman Pinschers, German Shepherds and later in life Whippets. While I was busy showing hunters as a teen in the U.S. and Canada, I discovered the perfect dog for me, a Pembroke Welsh Corgi, and received a corgi puppy for my 16th birthday in 1970. Four years later I bred my first litter under the Stonecroft prefix out of which came my first multiple Best in Show winner. I have bred 5 All-Breed Best in Show winners and 5 Specialty Best of Breed winners. Some highlights of dogs that I have bred are: Canada's first #1 Herding dog with the splitting of the Working Group in 1986, National Specialty Best of Breed winners in 3 countries (Canada, U.S. and England) with 3 different but related dogs. Best in Show winner 1998 Welsh Corgi League Diamond Jubilee (England – held once every 10 years) who was Top Corgi in England as well as the first Imported Male Pembroke to become a U.K. Champion which he completed in 6 shows. He was also summoned to the palace to breed one of Queen Elizabeth's bitches. Top Corgi in Canada with several dogs for a number of years. Still actively breeding on a smaller scale and exhibiting at specialties in Canada and the U.S.

I am a Life member of the Canadian Kennel Club, Canadian Dog Judges Association and several corgi clubs. I started judging in 1995 and I am now approved to judge All Breeds. I have judged in Canada, the United States and Australia.

I live in the beautiful countryside of Niagara Falls, Ontario with my corgis, a Papillion and three cats.

GLORIA GERINGER – my life in purebred dogs began in 1963 with a parti-color American Cocker from Maribeau Kennels, near Detroit, Michigan where I was raised. I showed many cockers to their championship that carried the Maribeau prefix before breeding on my own under Lancer. Besides cockers, in the 70's, I began breeding and showing Pointers to American and Canadian Championships. I then spent many years as an AKC licensed handler and became involved with many more breeds. I began judging in 1988, no longer handled and closed my breeding program.

I have had the honor of judging my own National, the American Spaniel Club, numerous times and several other breed Nationals. I have judged on five continents in the following countries: Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, England, Estonia, Ireland, Japan, Korea, Macau, Mexico, New Zealand, Russia, Slovenia, Spain, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand and Venezuela, many of these countries multiple times; most States in the US including Alaska and Hawaii. I was honored and humbled to judge the American Pointer Club National and the Canadian Kennel Club Purina Invitational, both in 2011.

In my private life, my husband and I have a home on four landscaped acres about 80 miles west of New Orleans where we enjoy our four retired mini-longhaired dachshunds and a 23 year old African Grey parrot. I attended Louisiana State University and am a retired auditor from State government.

I feel judging is an honor and a privilege with a tremendous responsibility to the breed and to the exhibitor. AKC has approved me to judge all Sporting, Hound, Non-Sporting, Toys, Terriers, and Boxers and Best in Show.

I would like to thank everyone for the honor of this assignment.

DEBORAH GRAFFMANN – I grew up in Quebec surrounded by animals. My family had German Shepherds, an Irish Terrier, and a Pomeranian. In the early 1970's I began showing and breeding Irish Setters; my handlers were also showing Whippets and I was able to obtain my first one from them; MaGriffe's Winged Food Whipper, who did nice winning in the group ring. I migrated from the Irish Setters to the Whippets and registered "Vantage" as a Whippet kennel in 1980. Vantage produced many champions including Specialty winners and is behind many winning lines today. My husband Gordon had a longing for a Boxer so we acquired our first one in 1991. We have imported top winning Boxers from Argentina from the famous Willsam Kennels. We now have our first Basset Hound.

I am the President of the Kilbride & District Kennel Club in Ontario. I have been judging since 1995, in the US and Canada and am now an All-Breed judge.

GLORIA KERR – of Arizona USA began her interest in dogs as a child and was introduced to dog shows in 1962 with a Golden Retriever puppy named Krishna's Golden Hunter CD or "Charlie". From the acquisition of this single dog grew the love of both the Golden Retriever and the Dog Show World.

She has since bred and titled numerous conformation champions under the name of Krishna Kennels. Several famous USA Golden Kennels are founded on her Krishna dogs. She has bred many champions in Golden Retrievers, Akitas, Pembroke Welsh Corgis and Chinese Cresteds. She has shown many of them to Conformation Best in Show and Best in Specialty wins. In Obedience she had multiple obedience titleholders and also trained for working certificates (WC) in the field with her Goldens.

I have been in the Top Ten Obedience Dogs in Canada 10 times, twice had the Top Obedience Dog In Canada as scored by the CKC, earned 21 perfect 200 scores, 365 HITS, have put 5 OTCh titles on Dogs, 3 MOTCh titles and 2 GMOTCh titles. I am also a breeder; my Kennel is Rideauview Goldens Reg'd ... I breed a line of Goldens that excel in Obedience, Field & Agility.

PIERRE LALONDE – I've had dogs all my life. I took my first obedience class in my late teens and was hooked. I joined a local dog club and the CKC in my early twenties and never looked back. As my obedience training experience grew, I volunteered to help the local instructor and soon was assisting, with hopes of becoming an obedience judge one day. That goal became a reality in 1995. Since then I have had the opportunity to judge all across Canada and in Bermuda. My judging responsibilities are shared between agility, obedience and rally-obedience as a judge with the CKC and the AAC. I was involved with the beginnings of agility for the CKC and until recently was also course approver. I still

perform this duty with the AAC. I've had the honour of judging the AAC Nationals championship four times, several AAC Regional's and several obedience specialties for breed clubs.

CONFORMATION

The following CKC conformation classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

Junior Puppy: for dogs 6 mths of age but under 9 mths of age.

Senior Puppy: for dogs 9 mths of age but under 12 mths of age

12-18 Months: for dogs 12 mths of age and under 18 mths of age

Canadian Bred: for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded.

Bred by Exhibitor: for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

Open: for all dogs.

<u>Specials Only:</u> dogs which are registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and have attained championship status may be entered in the 'Specials Only' class. <u>Exhibition Only:</u> for all dogs over 6 mths of age and eligible for registration with the CKC (non-competitive class).

OBEDIENCE

Pre-Novice: for any pure bred dog that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in

Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A dog may be entered in this class that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or US.

- <u>Novice A:</u> for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for this class.
- <u>Novice B:</u> for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class.
- <u>Novice C:</u> for any purebred dog that has gained a CD, CDX, UD or any other advanced title and exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice classes. Scores earned in Novice C are not eligible for High in Trial. This is an elective class and offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience. Dogs may be entered in Novice C class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial classes.
- <u>Open A:</u> for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD but has not won the title of CDX. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for entry in this class.
- <u>Open B:</u> for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD, CDX or UD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class. A dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B at any one trial. A dog eligible for UD is also eligible for entry in this class at the same trial.
- <u>UtilityA:</u> for any purebred dog that has won the title of CDX in CANADA. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'group examination' exercise.

<u>Utility B:</u> for any purebred dog and handler where the dog has achieved a CDEX and a UD title and for dogs and handlers where the handler has put a MOTCH title on any dog.

RALLY

- Rally Novice A: Dogs entered in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.
- <u>Rally Novice B:</u> Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. No dog may be entered in Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.
- <u>Rally Advanced A</u>: For dogs that have won the Rally Novice title but have not won the Rally Advanced title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.
- <u>Rally Advanced B</u>: for dogs that have won the Rally Novice title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.
- <u>Rally Excellent A:</u> for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title but have not won the Rally Excellent title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.
- <u>Rally Excellent B</u>: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title. No dog may be entered in the Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B class at any one trial.

ATTENTION ALL FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events do not require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). To obtain an ERN simply mail or fax a copy of the dog's registration certificate with a cheque, money order, or VISA/Mastercard number (expiry date, cardholder's name and signature) in the amount of \$61.40 payable to The Canadian Kennel Club. This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Rule books are \$6.00 and can be obtained by contacting the Canadian Kennel Club as above.

required to enter these shows or trials.

Effective January 1, 2011 - Non-Member Participation Fee

(This only applies to dogs wholly owned by non members and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member, nor does it affect US exhibitors who must apply for an ERN number as noted above)

A non-member resident in Canada is subject to the fee. Dogs co-owned with a CKC member are exempt. There are 2 options for non-members: a) Join the CKC or b) Pay the Non-Member Participation Fee

The fee is a yearly charge based on the calendar year January 1st to December 31st in which the awards, legs, points, titles, etc. were achieved. It is not based on the number of dogs or titles or awards earned, and is assessed against the owner(s).

Non-members will receive a letter from CKC Head Office informing them that they have 30 days to join the Club or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Dogs co-owned by two or more individuals ... the first person listed in the CKC dog records will be considered the caregiver of the dog and all communication will be sent to this person.

Payment of the Non-Member Participation Fee or becoming a CKC member will protect all awards, points, titles and legs in the calendar year in which they were earned. Failure to pay the fee within 30 days of the notice will result in all awards, legs, points, titles being cancelled. Once cancelled the awards, legs, points or titles will be given to the next applicable dog. Once cancellation takes place any subsequent awards titles, legs, etc. earned will automatically be cancelled without further notice.

The Non-Member Participation Fee is applicable starting at the first event in which the dog earns awards, points, titles, legs and is not prorated.

*Please note that the CKC Membership application and the Non-Member Participation Fee forms are available on the website under CKC Services and then Forms On-Line. If submitting a Membership Application, please ensure that you also complete the Non-Member Participation Fee form so that CKC is aware of the dogs involved.
