Allow 48 to 72 hours for a reply (Tuesday through Friday)
If having gonioscopy done let us know how many dogs as this takes extra time
- Registration - Dr Skorobohach is using OFA Online to fill out CAER eye exam results

Once you have your **registration number(s)** e-mail it to eyes.care@vca.com
This is vital information as it will keep the clinic running smoothly and on time
No paper copies, only online registrations will be accepted
- Exam - **Arrive 30 minutes early to your appointment time**
Exam is done 20 to 30 minutes after dilating drops are placed on the eyes
Dilation typically lasts 4-6 hours.
- Note - The following breeds are recommended to have a preliminary examination prior to initial pharmacological dilation to best facilitate identification of certain disorders
- Australian Shepherd
 - Dalmatian
 - Louisiana Catahoula Leopard Dog
 - Miniature American Shepherd
 - Miniature/Toy Australian Shepherd
- Note - The Eye Certification exam consists of indirect ophthalmoscopy and slit lamp Biomicroscopy. It is not a comprehensive ocular health examination, but rather an eye screening exam
