Baby Puppy (4 – 6 months of age)

Junior Puppy (6 – 9 months of age)

Senior Puppy (9 – 12 months of age)

12 – 18 months

Canadian Bred (dogs born in Canada)

Bred by Exhibitor (handler must be the breeder/owner of the dog)

Open Black

Specials Only (dogs which are Canadian Champions)

Veteran (7 – 9 yrs of age) & (9+ yrs of age) (dogs may be spayed or neutered)

Field Dog: For all Labrador Retrievers who have attained a title or placement in a field trial or test. This class is to be judged prior to Best in Breed judging and the winner of each sex will compete for 'best of Breed. Dogs may be sexually altered

Exhibition Only

Non-Regular Classes Dogs entered in any non-regular class must also be entered in a regular class of or for Exhibition Only - except Stud Dog and Brood Bitch whose get/progeny MUST be entered in a Regular Class.

Stud Dog: for any sire and 2 or more of his get. Sire and get need not be owned by the same person. Brood Bitch: Same as above for any dam and 2 or more of her progenies.

No refund after close of entries. Each day is a separate show, and the above fees apply per day, per show except as noted. (These fees include CKC recording fees + 5% G.S.T.)

Attention Foreign Exhibitors Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

Non-Member Participation Fee 24-12-3. Non-member participation fee a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee. b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be canceled. c)The Premium List must carry a note stating that "these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members

ATTENTION ALL FOREIGN EXHIBITORS - ERN NUMBERS Effective Jan. 1992, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an event registration number (ERN). This ERN number does not register a dog with the CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign owned dog to be awarded titles by the CKC. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN number, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with a cheque or VISA/Mastercard number, (expiry date, cardholders name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of ERN number. Cost \$55.00. ERN number must be applied for within 30 DAYS of the FIRST day of entering a CKC event.

Temporary Competition Numbers or (TCN) – A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event and the same TCN must be used foor all event entries for a dog until the dog is pemanently reistered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a (Performance Event Number) PEN off (Canine Companion Number) CCN.

While there is no fee to obtain a TCN, exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN fees (formelry called lsiting fees) when entering events using this number.

The process of obtaining a TCN will be self serve; exhibitors will be directed to the CKC website to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly upon completion.

Exhibitors may also obtain a TCN by completing a printed application and submitting it to the CKC by mail, or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division by telephone.

Please note that if your dog does not have a registration number or ERN, and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, score, or awards, there is not need to apply for a TCN. CKC records will updated accordingly.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. ENTRY FEES SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the Club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.

2. ENTRIES WILL BE ACKNOWLEDGED AFTER CLOSING DATE. Receipts, judging schedules, and exhibitor passes can be retrieved from the dogshow.ca website - <u>www.dogshow.ca</u>

3. 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. Rule 19.7

4. ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON LEASH WHILE ON THE GROUNDS. You are responsible for cleaning up if you permit your dog to relieve itself. Failure to do so may result in being expelled for one day's showing by the Superintendent.

7. "ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES." If not in competition the dog must wear a collar and be on leash a maximum of six (6) feet or appropriately confined in the benching

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Section 1. A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be provided hereunder.

Section 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded

WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dog competing	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

** includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards:

Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule as set forth above.

The new system provides for additional points, provided that the dog has defeated another dog, either at the breed level or at the group level, if a dog awarded WINNERS also placed in the Group, as listed hereunder.

A class dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than 5 points at any single show.

Grand Champion (GCh) Point Schedule

The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level

Best in Show (5 points)

(b) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC grand championship title. Points for this title may be accumulated at any time after the completion of the CKC grand championship but does not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship or the grand championship. A minimum of 100 points, which must include one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) plus three (3) Group 1st or three (3) breed specialty wins.

15.2.4 GRAND CHAMPION BRONZE (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained. a. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand championship. b. To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. c. Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 GRAND CHAMPION SILVER (GChS) a. The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze. b. To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 GRAND CHAMPION GOLD (GChG) a. The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver. b. To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT (GCh.Ex) 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC Grand Champion Silver title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website. the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

a. one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed National specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).

b. three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.

c. a CKC performance title from any CKC event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance Title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward it to CKC upon completion of requirements above. 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honored up until July 1, 2022.

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of the Edmonton Kennel Club Show & Trials if it:

- Is know to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or any other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to event)
- Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or any other communicable disease.

The Edmonton Kennel Club has the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

COVID 19 – The Edmonton Kennel Club recognizes the impact and risks that COVID-19 continues to have on our community. It is important to ensure the safety of our club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges, and exhibitors. The EKC will follow all federal, provincial, municipal and facility protocols related to COVIS-19 that are in place at the time of the show, and by entering our show you agree to abide by these rules. If you have any objection to following our guidelines or restrictions, please do not enter this show.

If any club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges or fellow exhibitors are subject to abusive language or behavior, or if you fail to abide by the show protocols, this may result in your dismissal from the show with no right of entry refund.
