Oxford Dog Sports and United Greyhound Club are pleased to offer Total Dog at this event.

6. Total Dog Award.

A club (or with special written approval by UKC, a combination of clubs holding events in conjunction with each other) offering conformation and at least one eligible performance event may apply to offer the Total Dog Award when submitting its "Event Application for a Scheduled Weekend". Clubs hosting more than one conformation and/or performance event on the day Total Dog awards are offered may have all events considered eligible when determining Total Dog qualifiers.

a. Eligible dogs.

Dogs that are permanently registered with UKC as of the day of the show and dogs that have a valid Temporary Listing (TL) number as of the day of the show are eligible to compete for the Total Dog Award.

b. Requirements for Total Dog Award.

To be eligible for this award, a dog must meet the requirements listed below. Compete in conformation with competition and win one of the following classes:

(a) Best Male/Female of Variety

(b) Best Male/Female

(c) Best of Winners

(d) Champion

(e) Grand Champion

(f) Best of Breed

(g) Group 1 through 4 (Note: Group 4 win only counts if there are five or more breeds in the Group class.)

(h) Best In Multi-Breed Show

(i) Reserve Best In Multi-Breed Show

(j) Best In Show

(k) Reserve Best In Show

ii. Earn a qualifying score in a licensed class at a UKC Performance Event (Agility, Obedience, Rally Obedience, Weight Pull, Terrier Race or UKC licensed Hunt events).

c. For the purpose of this award, competition through Best of Breed is defined as defeating another dog of the same breed. If there is no competition of the same breed, a Best of Breed winner who defeats another dog of a different breed by placing in the Group, by winning Best or Reserve Best In Multi-Breed Show, or by winning Best or Reserve Best In Show shall be considered to have a win with competition.

WEIGHT PULL

Section 4. Weight Pull Titles.

United Weight Pull (UWP). To earn this title, a dog must earn a qualifying leg at three different UKC licensed weight pulls. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls that may be earned under the same judge. A dog earns a qualifying pull by completing an uninterrupted pull of a weighted vehicle loaded with the following weights:

Wheels on natural and artificial surfaces. Eight times the dog's body weight on the day of the event.

Rails. Ten times the dog's body weight on the day of the event.

Snow. Three times the dog's body weight on the day of the event.

Advanced Puller (AP). Any dog that has earned a United Weight Pull title is eligible to start earning legs toward the Advanced Puller (AP) title beginning at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. To earn an Advanced Puller title, a dog must earn 10 qualifying pulls by pulling the same amount of weight as outlined for the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. The AP title will have numeric designations to signify the number of time the title has been completed; for example, AP2, AP3 etc. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls that may be earned under the same judge.

Versatile Puller Novice (VPN). Any dog that has earned a United Weight Pull title is eligible to start earning legs toward the Versatile Puller Novice (VPN) title beginning at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. To earn a Versatile Puller Novice title, a dog must earn a minimum of 10 qualifying pulls. A minimum of 5 qualifying pulls on one weighted vehicle or surface (Natural, Artificial, Rails or Snow), and 5 additional pulls which may be earned on any combination of at least two types of weighted vehicles or surfaces by pulling the same amount of weight as outlined for the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls that may be earned under the same judge.

Versatile Puller Advanced (VPA). Any dog that has earned a United Weight Pull title is eligible to start earning legs toward the Versatile Puller Advanced (VPA) title beginning at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. To earn a Versatile Puller Advanced title, a dog must earn a total of 10 qualifying pulls. A minimum of 5 qualifying pulls must be earned on two different vehicles or surfaces by pulling the same amount of weight as outlined for the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls that may be earned under the same judge.

Versatile Puller Excellent (VPE). Any dog that has earned a United Weight Pull title is eligible to start earning legs toward the Versatile Puller Excellent (VPE) title beginning at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. To earn a Versatile Puller Excellent title, a dog must earn a total of 15 qualifying pulls. A minimum of 5 qualifying pulls must be earned on three different vehicles or surfaces by pulling the same amount of weight as outlined for the United

Weight Pull (UWP) title. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls that may be earned under the same judge.

Versatile Puller Ultimate (VPU). Any dog that has earned a United Weight Pull title is eligible to start earning legs toward the Versatile Puller Ultimate (VPU) title beginning at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. To earn a Versatile Puller Ultimate title, a dog must earn a total of 20 qualifying pulls. A minimum of 5 qualifying pulls must be earned on each of the different vehicles or surfaces by pulling the same amount of weight as outlined for the United Weight Pull (UWP) title. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls that may be earned under the same judge.

United Weight Pull Champion (UWPCH) title. Any dog that has earned the United Weight Puller (UWP) title is eligible to start earning points toward the United Weight Pull Champion title. Accumulation of points toward the 12

United Weight Pull Champion (UWPCH) title begins at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the UWP title. To earn this title, a dog must meet all of the requirements below:

Weight Pull Championship Points. A total of 100 weight pull championship points must be earned. Points may be earned from the A or B division or any combination of the two. To earn Weight Pull championship points, dogs must pull a minimum amount of weight per body pound. The number of points earned increases as the amount of weight per body pound increases. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls or championship points that may be earned under the same judge.

United Weight Pull Champion Excellent (UWPCHX) title. Any dog that has earned the United Weight Pull Champion (UWPCH) title is eligible to start earning points toward the United Weight Pull Champion Excellent title. Accumulation of points toward the title of United Weight Pull Champion Excellent (UWPCHX) title begin at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the UWPCH title. To earn this title, a dog must meet all of the requirements below:

Weight Pull Championship Points. A total of 250 weight pull championship points must be earned. Points may be earned from the A or B division or any combination of the two. To earn Weight Pull championship points, dogs must pull a minimum amount of weight per body pound. The number of points earned increases as the amount of weight per body pound increases. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls or championship points that may be earned under the same judge.

United Grand Weight Pull Champion (UGWPCH) title. Any dog that has earned the United Weight Pull Champion Excellent (UWPCHX) title is eligible to start earning points toward the United Grand Weight Pull Champion title. Accumulation of points toward the title of United Grand Weight Pull Champion (UGWPCH) title begin at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the UWPCHX title. To earn this title, a dog must meet all of the requirements below:

Weight Pull Championship Points. A total of 250 weight pull championship points must be earned. Points must all be earned from the B division. To earn Weight Pull championship points, dogs must pull a minimum amount of weight per body pound. The number of points earned increases as the amount of weight per body pound increases. There is no restriction of the number of qualifying pulls or championship points that may be earned under the same judge.

United Elite Weight Pull Champion (UEWPCH) title. Any dog that has earned the United Grand Weight Pull Champion (UGWPCH) title is eligible to start earning points toward the United Elite Weight Pull Champion title. Accumulation of points toward the title of United Elite Weight Pull Champion (UEWPCH) title begin at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the UGWPCH title. To earn this title, a dog must meet all of the requirements below:

Weight Pull Championship Points. A total of 500 weight pull championship points must be earned. Points must all be earned from the B division. To earn Weight Pull championship points, dogs must pull a minimum amount of weight per body pound. The number of points earned increases as the amount of weight per body pound increases. There is no restriction of the

number of qualifying pulls or championship points that may be earned under the same judge.

United Weight Pull Versatile (UWPV) title. Any dog that has earned the United Weight Puller (UWP) title is eligible to start earning points toward the United Weight Pull Versatile title. Accumulation of points toward the United Weight Pull Versatile (UWPV) title begin at the next pull following the completion of the requirements of the UWP title. To earn this title, a dog must meet all of the requirements below:

Weight Pull Championship Points. A total of 200 weight pull championship points must be earned. A minimum of 100 points must be earned on one weighted vehicle or surface, and a minimum of 100 additional points must be earned on any combination of at least two types of weighted vehicles or surfaces.

COURSING APTITUDE TEST (All breeds)

Eligible breeds:

All breeds and mixed breeds with an LP number.

Title Requirements

In order to earn the Coursing Aptitude (CA) title, a dog must complete 3 qualifying runs. Dogs will run alone, and must complete the course with enthusiasm, and without interruption.

Once a dog has earned the Coursing Aptitude title, he may earn the Coursing Aptitude Excellent (CAX) title by accumulating an additional 12 qualifying runs.

Once a dog has earned the Coursing Aptitude Excellent title, he may earn the Coursing Aptitude Supreme title by accumulating an additional 15 qualifying runs. The CAS is a repeatable title (eg, CAS2, CAS3, etc).

COURSING TEST (Sighthounds)

Eligible breeds:

Afghan Hound, Azawakh, Basenji, Borzoi, Canaan Dog, Carolina Dog, Chart Polski, Cirneco dell' Etna, Greyhound, Hungarian Greyhound, Ibizan Hound, Irish Wolfhound, Italian Greyhound, New Guinea Singing Dog, Peruvian Inca Orchid, Pharaoh Hound, Podengo Portugueso, Rhodesian Ridgeback, Saluki, Scottish Deerhound, Silken Windhound, Sloughi, Spanish Greyhound (Galgo), Thai Ridgeback, Whippet, Xoloitzcuintli, and dogs of these breeds, as well as mixed sighthound breeds with a Limited Privilege number, or Unrecognized Breeds with a PL number.

Title Requirements

In order to earn the Coursing Tested (CT) title, a dog must complete 3 qualifying runs. One run must be alone, one run must be with another dog of the same breed or similar running style, and the third leg may be earned either way, under at least 2 different judges. Once a dog has earned the Coursing Tested title, he is eligible to enter the Regular Stakes.

Once the dog earns the CT and moves to the Regular Stakes, he may also earn legs towards the CTX (Coursing Tested Excellent) by running in at

least two courses, and CTS (Coursing Tested Supreme) by winning at least one of those courses.

REGULAR STAKES (Sighthounds)

- Stakes are run in a brace elimination format.
- Dogs will run within their breed. Breeds with fewer than 4 dogs entered will run in mixed stakes with breeds of similar running style.
- All dogs will run at least twice, winners will advance until one dog remains undefeated.
- Points are awarded to the Stake Winner, and the two Runners Up, as well as the highest advancing dog of each breed in a Mixed Stake.
- Titles may be earned in both Breed and Mixed Stakes.
- **Dogs with coursing and racing titles from other organizations are exempt from the CT requirement – submit proof of title with your first entry. See rule book for acceptable titles.**

General Information

All dogs must check in by the designated Check In time, or they will be marked absent.

Lame dogs and females in season may not be entered. Entry fees will be refunded if the Meet Secretary is notified prior to Check In.

Each dog will run at least twice unless dismissed, excused, or withdrawn by the owner.

Breeds with at least 4 dogs entered will run in a breed stake. Breeds with fewer than 4 entered will run in a mixed stake with other breeds of similar running style. Stakes will consist of 4, 6, or 8 dogs.

In the first round, winning dogs will advance; losing dogs will advance to the secondary bracket. In the second and subsequent rounds, winning dogs will advance, losing dogs will be eliminated.

Byes will be run (a single dog advancing will run alone).

Standard coursing colors will be used.

Lurchers, longdogs and coldbloods are eligible to run as Sighthounds, provided they have an LP (Limited Privilege) number.

Judging

A standardized course plan of approximately 500 to 700 yards will be used, and each part of the course demonstrates speed, agility, or endurance.

Each skill is judged on one third of the course; speed is judged on the run-up (first portion), agility is judged through the agility portion (second portion), and endurance is judged on the return to the start (third portion). Judges will indicate the winner following each course.

Ties will be re-run immediately, if necessary.

Dogs will have at least a 20 minute break between courses.

- All entries must be submitted on the current "Official UKC* Entry Form". You may use one entry form to enter the same dog in more than one activity on the same weekend.
- Use a separate entry form for each dog entered in a club's event.
- Dog not UKC registered? Apply for a Temporary Listing Number (TL) online at www.ukcdogs.com or call the Dog Events Department at (269) 343-9020. (TL fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and do not apply to the cost of permanent registration.)
- Mail all completed entry forms to the Event Secretary listed under the event, unless otherwise specified. Make checks payable to host club.
- Obedience Trials, Agility Trials, Rally Obedience Trials, and Weight Pull events are open to all UKC recognized breeds and mixed-breed dogs with a valid Limited Privilege number. The Coursing Aptitude Test is open to all UKC registered and Mixed breed dogs with a valid Limited Privilege number.
- We want you to keep the points earned at UKC Licensed events. Important things to remember:**
 - All dogs entering UKC events must be permanently registered, have a valid Temporary Listing Number, or a Limited Privilege number.
 - All entry forms must be completed and signed. Incorrect information submitted on the entry form may invalidate your wins.
 - To be eligible to enter into the Breeder/Handler class, you must be one of the breeders of record, or a member of the immediate family of one of the breeders of record. Immediate family includes: spouse, parent, step-parent, child, step-child, brother or sister, so long as the handler is not a professional handler as defined by UKC Rules and Regulations.

7. Licensed Conformation classes consist of:

- A. Regular Classes. Classes for intact dogs:** Puppy (6 mos., under 1 yr.); Junior (1 yr., under 2 yrs.); Senior (2yrs., under 3 yrs.); Adult (3 yrs. And up); Breeder/Handler (6 mos. and up, handled by breeder or member of breeder's family); Champion; and Grand Champion.
- B. Altered Classes. Classes for altered dogs.** Altered Puppy (6 mos., under 1 yr.); Altered Junior (1 yr., under 2 yrs.); Altered Senior (2yrs., under 3 yrs.); Altered Adult (3 yrs. And up); Altered Breeder/Handler (6 mos. and up, handled by breeder or member of breeder's family); Altered Champion; and Altered Grand Champion.
- C. Junior Showmanship Classes. Consist of:** Pee Wee (over 2 yrs., under 4 yrs.); Sub-Junior (4 yrs., under 8 yrs.); Novice Junior, Open Junior (8 yrs., under 13 yrs.); Novice Senior, Open Senior (13 yrs., under 18 yrs.)
