Trial Rules and General Information

- 1.No entry will be accepted unless completed in full. Please note that the full name and address of all owners must be filled in. Incomplete entries will be returned. The Trial Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry as prescribed by CKC rules.
- 2.No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fees. Telephone and fax entries not accepted.
- 3.Cancellation of entries after the closing date is prohibited, except where allowed according to CKC rules. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, sick, lame, or excused by a veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee, or because it is entered incorrectly.
- 4.If, because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the trial, no refund of entry fees will be made.
- 5.The Trial Superintendent will be in full charge of the trial.
- 6.The River City Labrador Enthusiasts will use due care and diligence concerning the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability, in the event of an accident or other misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 7.As per CKC obedience rules and regulations, section 20.7, no judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor shall be subject to indignities of any kind.
- 8.Only dogs entered in the RCLE trials are allowed in the trial building.
Dogs must be removed from the building following the conclusion of the last trial.
- 9.ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES.
- 10.There is a designated outdoor exercise area at the trial venue; all exhibitors are asked to use only that area for exercising their dogs, and must clean up after their dogs. PLEASE RESPECT NEIGHBOURING PROPERTIES.
- 11.All exhibitors are expected to be familiar with the CKC OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES & REGULATIONS. Copies are available on the CKC website.

Foreign Exhibitors

Please purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in CANADIAN DOLLARS. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they must be payable in U.S. dollars for the full amount of the entry. Please do not send personal cheques marked “Payable in Canadian Funds” or “at par”. The banks will not clear them. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Canadian Kennel Club Non-Member Participation Fee

The non-member participation fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC. It is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. For the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.

Obedience Classifications

PRE-NOVICE

The Pre-Novice class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all five exercises unless they have two or more dogs entered. In such cases, they must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A

The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families, and must be eligible to handle, under Section 10.1.4. No person who has exhibited a dog that has earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

NOVICE B

The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises unless they have two or more dogs entered. In such cases, they must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Novice A and Novice B class at any one trial.

NOVICE C

The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises unless they have two or more dogs entered. In such cases, they must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice C class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice C class are not eligible for High in Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE

The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

OPEN A

The Open A classes shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in these classes must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in these classes and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in these classes. When a dog is wrongfully entered in these classes, any score awarded will be cancelled. No dog may be entered in more than one Open class at any one trial.

OPEN B

The Open B classes shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD. Dogs that have earned the title of CDX or any higher obedience titles may enter either of the Open B classes. A dog may also be entered in the Utility class in the same trial. Dogs in these classes may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in these classes. The same handler must handle each dog in all seven exercises unless they have two or more dogs entered. In such case, they must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise(s). Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed for Open B. These choices will not be disclosed to exhibitors until they are posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of each class and never more than one hour before the start of the trial. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines, so they will be used approximately the same number of times. No dog may be entered in more than one Open class at any one trial.

UTILITY A

The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of OTCH. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

UTILITY B

The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX or OTCH. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class and never more than one hour before the start of the trial.

EXHIBITION ONLY

This is an official class. A dog may be entered for Exhibition Only, which is an official class that must be specified on the entry form. All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as for a dog entered for competition. No dog so entered can compete in any regular class; however, it may be entered in and compete in any unofficial class or parade offered at the trial on payment of the prescribed fee.
