GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Muskoka District Kennel Club will use care and diligence for the welfare of all dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liabilities in the event of an accident or other mishap, however caused, to either dog or exhibitor. A dog shall not be touched without the permission of the owner or agent.
- 2. Only dogs entered in Trials will be permitted in the Trial Building.
- 3. Trial start times will be indicated on the judging schedule.
- 4. Trial Precincts shall be the MDKC Building
- 5. Rally Ring size shall be 35'x 72'

STATEMENT ON BULLYING

The MDKC has a zero-tolerance policy regarding bullying. Any individual utilizing bullying tactics at the trial grounds will be required to leave the premises immediately and for the remainder of the event. No refunds will be given in this case. A report will be filed with the CKC and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such actions as it deems fit.

What is Bullying? The term bullying refers to treating individuals in a mean, insulting or abusive way, regardless if it is initiated deliberately or unconsciously. Bullying may cause the affected person to feel upset, afraid, isolated or humiliated.

Examples include but are not limited to:

- Insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits
- Spreading false or malicious rumours, gossip, or innuendo
- Berating/belittling an individual
- Unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others
- Using insulting nicknames
- Engaging in humiliating practical jokes

- Physical gestures that intimidate, offend, degrade or humiliate
- Mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms
- Yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces or belittles

NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE - Effective January 1, 2011:

- a) A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Obedience Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club

Chapter 19 – Section 19.7 of the Obedience Rules and Regulations states: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer, or competitor at an Obedience Trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Obedience Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

6.5.2 **Bitches in Season** are not permitted to compete. When a bitch comes into season after entry of the bitch has been submitted to the trial secretary, a veterinarian's certificate, certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial, must be submitted to the trial secretary on or before the date of the trial. A refund of the entry fee, service charge and listing fee will be given

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Effective Jan. 1/92, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Please contact CKC for further info.

TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN. Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregistered dog of a CKC recognized or listed breed to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed.

CANINE COMPANION NUMBER

In order to compete, mixed and unrecognized breed dogs must have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) from the Canadian Kennel Club. A dog eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog with a TCN. WHICH CLASS TO ENTER:

Please read new rule changes for *ALL* A stream classes effective Jan 2024!

Novice A:

- If your dog has not earned a CKC Rally Novice title, or any CKC obedience title other than PCD.
- If you have not titled any other dog to a CDX in CKC obedience or a **CKC Rally Advanced title**.
- If you own, co-own or are a member of the immediate family of the owner.

Novice B:


- If you or your dog do not meet the criteria for Novice A
- And the dog you are entering has not earned a qualifying score in Rally Advanced.
