AMERICAN STAFFORDSHIRE TERRIERS NOW AND BEFORE

By Rade Dakić

I have been involved in dog sport for many years and I am often asked what I think is different today compared to the time I started, how our breed changed and what I feel are the best and also the worst changes that occurred. I may say a lot of things had changed. It is the same in our everyday life - a lot of things have changed if we compare life today with that of 20 or 30 years ago.



I must admit I prefer the life the way it was before, even if we did not have mobile telephones, internet or other technical things which are available to us today. In some way all those things help us, but on the other hand they are forcing us to live the way of life that we may not like. However, this is a philosophical question and I will just add that I think life 20 or 30 years ago was more romantic.



It is the same with the amstaffs. A while ago everything was done with much more romance and love. Winning a show 25 years ago, one would be filled with joy and pride. Today people are less happy, even if they win the World Champion Title. And, the title is important only on the day of the world show or maybe 2 weeks after that. After one month everybody forgets the world champion!!!!



My impression is that before people had much more love and passion for everything. Today quality of amstaffs changed too and is now different from country to country. Twenty years ago, Holland and Germany were leading amstaff countries in Europe, but not any more. They reached the peak some 20 years ago, but after restrictive laws adopted by their governments they had a big crisis. Now they are slowly recovering and Dutch breeders even made some fantastic results in 2016. As for amstaffs, I think that the world's leading countries today are Spain, Russia, Serbia, Italy, Hungary, etc. Just look at the results at World and European shows in the last decade and you will see where Top dogs are coming from.





When I started with amstaffs we did not have mobile telephones, internet, Facebook, we did not have digital cameras. If I wanted to learn something, I had to write my letters, usually by hand or, on a good day by writing machine. Then I put it in an envelope, went to post-office, put a post mark and sent the letter to USA, Canada or Holland, and then waited for a minimum of two weeks for a reply.

I had an old Russian photo camera. For one good photo I had to use at least two films (by 36 frames each), go to photo shop and have all 72 photos done on paper, then I had to choose one or two best ones, copy them and send to many addresses. It was much more difficult than today.



Now you use a digital camera, shots cost you nothing, you can delete all that you don't like and the ones which you do, you can download to your computer and with one press of the button the whole world can see them. I remember I was the happiest when I got some magazines from Germany, Holland or USA. I waited for the postman as if he should bring me candies. But, back then we all had a lot of enthusiasm. We wanted to learn about amstaffs. We wanted to share what we learned or got to know.



Today I have the impression that new generation is not interested to learn. They do not have amstaff books, magazines, they do not know blood lines, they know nothing about history of the amstaffs, about the names of some very famous people who helped to establish the breed, about the best dogs from past, of important pedigrees. All their knowledge is from internet and Facebook and they think it is enough. They are mostly interested in what will be at next show and whether they will win or not or, when the bitch will come in season to have puppies with the neighbour's dog to get some money.

There is a joke that today, for most of this new, fresh breeders the most important title is not the Club Champion, National or International Champion. The

name of the most important title is – SOLD!

Today, breeders must be very careful not to lose that Old Type, we have already lost majority of that old school breeders, we desperately need new mentors. Today amstaffs maybe better in quality, handling is better, and so are some other things, but I am afraid that big percentage of new owners have forgotten the main point of being in dog sport.

Somehow, I prefer old times. It seems to me that those were the times of improvement, progress, humanism and romanticism, and today we are in era of decadency.

But unfortunately we can say this for the world in general.

Note: There will be no refunds for duplicate entries or overpayment of fees.

It is the owner of the dog entered that is responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Please review email confirmations so corrections may be made **prior to closing date** to avoid disappointment.

8.6.1 The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause.

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge wither directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Exhibitors, handlers, judges and assistants are expected to participate with honesty, fairness and integrity, ever mindful of the practice of “good sportsmanship”, before, during and after the Vernon show. Any person engaging in an activity that might be considered malicious, threatening or constitutes bullying, including but not limited to social media, will be asked to leave the show without compensation and will be banned from any future Vernon shows.

A service charge of 10% will be assessed. This includes entries sent online or post using a credit card or interac for payment.

ALL Entries **MUST** be received by closing date:
WEDNESDAY, June 17th, 2026 @ 9:00pm Pacific Time

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTHS – This class shall be for any dog 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. Champions of an country are excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co- owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs.

VETERAN CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and older on the day of the show. Class will be divided 7 Yrs to under 9 Yrs and 9+ Yrs. The winners of each class in each sex will compete for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class **MUST** be received by the Show Secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO BREED JUDGING**. TCN FEES WILL NOT be refunded.

UNOFFICIAL CLASS

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class **MAY NOT COMPETE** in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades **ONLY**

BABY PUPPY - This class is for dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

STUD DOG & GET - This class is for a stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership need not be identical. The stud dog may be spayed/neutered and must be entered in a regular class or in exhibition only. Get must be entered in a regular class

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY - This class has the same requirements as the Stud Dog and Get

BRACE - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

BREEDER/OWNER/HANDLER – must have bred the dog, own the dog and show the dog at all levels of competition. Class is free but you must indicate eligibility on entering.

SWEEPSTAKES - Saturday, July 4th, 2026 preceding Conformation

Juvenile Sweepstakes

Judge: tba

Juvenile Sweepstakes is to all puppies four months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following four classes (divided by sex):

- Baby Puppy - 4 months and under 6 months
- Junior Puppy - 6 months and under 9 months
- Senior Puppy - 9 months and under 12 months
- Juvenile Puppy - 12 months and under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 50% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes

Runner Up in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes

1st thru 4th in each class - rosette

25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

Veteran Sweepstakes

Judge: tba

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all dogs 7 years of age and over and entered in a regular class or for exhibition only on the same day. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in exhibition only.

Dogs to be judged in one of the following two classes (divided by sex):

- Junior Veteran - 7 years and under 9 years
- Senior Veteran - 9 years and over

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Veteran Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 50% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes

Runner Up in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes

1st to 4th in each class - rosette

25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from:
The CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9 or online at www.ckc.ca

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. **DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING.** The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are **PACIFIC TIME.**
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog **BEFORE** taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms and must be on leash at all times on the show grounds with the exception of the obedience rings.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors/concessions.

The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

Dogs must be exercised in the designated areas.

All RV units must have buckets underneath for their sink drains. Anyone found discharging water on the grounds will be removed by order of the Health Department and may be subject to a fine.

Any videographer or photographer, other than the official videographer/photographer, that is going to take picture for which they will be remunerated will require written permission from the Vernon & District Club Show Committee and/or the official show videographer/photographer.

The American Staffordshire Terrier should give the impression of great strength for his size, a well put-together dog, muscular, but agile and graceful. He should be stocky, not long-legged or racy in outline.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the “CKC Dog Show Rules”, and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient.
