Judges' Biographies



Dr. Luis Fernando Arce

Veterinarian and Zootechnician graduated from Veritas University and Central American Livestock School respectively.

My family always had dogs at home and was dedicated to raising livestock and working horses. My father is also a doctor by profession, always fond of different breeds, especially I remember our first dog, a German Shepherd, and then Chihuahuas, and Miniature Pinschers.

It was not until later, at a very early age when he ventured into the Great Dane breed, and later into the English Bulldog Breed. In both breeds I have managed to achieve success as a breeder and handler. Managing to breed the first Best In Show-winning female harlequin specimen produced in the country and very well ranked in other countries in the area. Breeder of the only Great Dane to win the open category in Harlequin of the United States National. Also managing to place one of my specimens as number two dog of all breeds. First time in the history of our country that a Great Dane has achieved such an award.

I have given multiple seminars with the Great Dane Club of America and Bulldog Club Of America. I have trained in the medical field in equine and canine reproduction at Colorado State University and Gainesville University respectively. Currently active in both breeds and owner of the Casaarabal Kennel located in Costa Rica in partnership with Mr. Carlos Campos.

Since 2000, I have had the opportunity to compete with both breeds in different countries, achieving very important victories in the USA, Mexico, Nicaragua, Honduras, and Costa Rica. Active in the breeding of Nelore cattle, Simbrah, Simental and Arabian breed horses. I am an active member of ACC.



Mr. JASON ATTRIDGE - AUSTRALIA

During my childhood, my parents showed Welsh Corgi Pembrokes, and I commenced in purebred dogs with Jack Russell Terriers in the 1990's, and Border Collies with my wife, Nadia under the 'Classicyds' prefix in 2009.

I have been fortunate to own and campaign Australian Kelpies, a Welsh Corgi Cardigan, a Petit Basset Griffon Vendeen and a Hungarian Vizsla to their Australian Championship titles.

Together with Nadia and our daughter, Mel we have bred Royal BIS, Royal BOB, All Breeds BIS and Speciality BIS winners, and have multiple Supreme Champions, Grand Champions and Champions in both Jack Russell Terriers and now Border Collies.

Our kennel has produced the youngest two Supreme Jack Russell Terriers of all time in Australia, and for 3 consecutive years, we were Australia's Number JRT kennel.

We have had the Number 1 Border Collies in Queensland for the last 4 years.

I commenced my Judging journey in 2011 and in 2020 I was honoured to be appointed as an All-Breeds Judge with the ANKC (now Dogs Australia)

My wife Nadia Attridge is licenced to judge Toys, Hounds, Pastoral/Herding and Non-Sporting Groups; and my daughter Mel Attridge is licenced to judge Terriers, Hounds, Pastoral/Herding, Gundogs (all) and Non-Sporting Groups.

My passion for pure-bred dogs extends to me being heavily involved throughout the years in numerous aspects of our hobby.

In addition to Conformation, I compete with our Border Collies in a range of dog sports, titling dogs in Endurance Trials, Obedience, Rally O and Trick Dog Trials, and I am a licenced Endurance Trial Judge.

I have been exceptionally fortunate to have been able to judge across all states of Australia, the USA, the Philippines, South Africa, China and New Zealand, and feel privileged to have met so many amazing people across this hobby.

Dr. Molina is a Breeder of giant and miniature schnauzers, as well as standard short-haired and wire-haired dachshunds.

My favorite breeds of all time are Longhaired Dachshunds – both Miniature and Standard. I have bred them from over 40 years, and took on the challenge of breeding and showing the dapple pattern on the many colours the Dachshund offers. Other breeds owned or shown include: English Setter, Doberman, Chow Chow, Bull Mastiff, German Shepherd, Sheltie, Golden Retriever, Nova Scotia Duck Tollers, and Scottish Terriers. Raised on a mixed farm with a variety of animals, horses and dogs being my favorites. I co-owned a couple of racing thoroughbreds and still frequent to local track. Another good experience in dogs was grooming with a professional in Florida after which I produced a DVD on grooming Longhaired Dachshunds. Sales have topped 100.

I have been judging at dog shows since 1991. I am licensed to judge all breeds and groups. Extensive travel on assignments includes Canada, the USA, Mexico, China, Australia, and South Africa. I have attended Crufts and Westminster. I have judged specialties for Dachshunds, Dobermans, Weimaraners, English Setters, Boxers, Brittany Spaniel, Bassett, Irish Wolfhound, Siberian Husky, St. Bernard, Cane Corso, Corgi (Pembroke).

In my real life I wrote commercials and did promotions for local radio/TV stations for 20 years, plus other jobs dealing with the general public for approx. 15 years. I wrote a weekly pet column and also gardening column; Regional reporter for a dog publication for 10 years; plus, several articles on the Dachshund breeds published in Dachshund books and magazines.

I also support purebred dogs by serving on assorted all breed and Dachshund club committees plus ring stewarding at their shows. Lifetime member of CKC; life/original member of the Prairie Dachshund Club; member of the national Miniature Dachshund Club. A breeder of Merit with the American Kennel Club.

Class Structure (Age Requirements)

1. PEE WEE

For handlers 4 years of age up to 6 years of age. Optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded, participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

2A. JUNIOR NOVICE

For handlers 7 to 10 years who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

2B. JUNIOR OPEN

For handlers 7 to 10 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Junior Novice Class, OR any handler wishing to enter this level. It is understood that once that handler has entered and competed in the Open Class, he/she may not compete in the Novice Class again.

3A. INTERMEDIATE NOVICE CLASS

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

3B. INTERMEDIATE OPEN CLASS

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have won six first places in the same class with competition.

4A. SENIOR NOVICE CLASS

For handlers 15 years of age and up to 18 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.

4B. SENIOR OPEN CLASS

For handlers 15 years of age and up to 18 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that he/she has enough experience to compete at this level.

Entry Information

1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners must be filled in.
2. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
3. The Club and MJN Show Services will not be responsible of cash sent through the mail.
4. The Club reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.
5. There is no refund for duplicate cheques. Every effort will be made to find all duplicate entries, however if the entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, no refund will be made.
6. Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that the dog is absent, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, disqualified or barred from competition by action of the bench Committee.
7. Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials or unfinished Specials back to the classes is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Only dogs already registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, or eligible for such registration, can be entered. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC Rules. **Entries close 8 P.M. (ET) Wednesday, July 2, 2025, and must be in the hands of the Show Secretary by that date.**
8. Identification cards and judging schedules will be e-mailed as soon as possible after the entries close.
9. Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. **Any NSF cheques will be subject to a \$35 service charge.**
10. All dogs must be attended to by its owner and/or handler day and night (24hrs). No dogs are to be left unattended on the premises and/or buildings of the events.
11. The Ontario Breeders Association and its Executive/Members will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of theft.

USA Exhibitors

Bank drafts or money orders in Canadian Funds and personal cheques, payable in U.S. funds, and for the full amount of the entry will be accepted. Personally discounted cheques will not be honoured. Please do not mark personal cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as such items are not cleared through the banks. Your cooperation is appreciated.

General Information

1. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC Rules.
2. The Ontario Breeders Association will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of accident, or other misfortunes, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
3. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of Entry will be made.
4. Dogs may arrive any time prior to their scheduled time of Judging. Dogs not required for further judging will be excused. Judges will not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners/Agents are responsible to have their dogs present when their classes are called to be judged.
5. Judging start times to be specified in the judging schedule. Starting time of each ring will be specified in judging schedule.
6. SHOW PRECINCTS: Lombardy Agricultural Fairgrounds. Dogs not entered in these shows will **not** be allowed within the show precincts.
Rule: To ensure a healthy and enjoyable environment for all attendees, the use of any drugs and the smoking of cannabis products are strictly prohibited within the defined show precinct of the Lombardy Fairgrounds. This includes, but is not limited to, all buildings, tents, outdoor spaces within the event boundaries – show precincts. Violators may be subject to removal from the premises and further action as deemed necessary by fairground or event organizers. No monetary compensation for entries/expenses will be provided to handler, owner, attendee, exhibitor and/or breeder; and violators will be banned from any future shows held by this club.
7. Exhibitors are requested to keep their grooming and crating areas clean and tidy. The Show Superintendent has the authority to ask exhibitors to move or take down crates and private exercise pens, etc. Failure to do so when requested could result in disciplinary action.

Refund Policy

The Ontario Breeders Association has instituted the following refund policy in the event of Show/Event(s) Cancellation.

From opening of entries **up to June 20, 2025** – Refunds for Show/Event(s) Cancellation shall be **80%**. The remainder will be retained by the Club to cover costs.

Between June 21 to July 1, 2025 – Refunds for Show/Event(s) Cancellation shall be **70%**. The remainder will be retained by the Club to cover costs.

As of July 2, 2025 – There shall be **NO REFUNDS** for Show/Event(s) Cancellation.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.

The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

TCNs can be obtained through your CKC member portal or by contacting the CKC.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, and do not have a CKC registration number, will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Fee is \$64.00 per dog, plus applicable taxes.

Non-Member Participation Fee

Effective January 1, 2011:

- a) A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$170.00 plus applicable taxes.
 - b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
 - c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
 - d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

Exhibitors, handlers, judges and assistants are expected to participate with honesty, fairness and integrity, ever mindful of the practice of "good sportsmanship," before, during and after this show. Any person engaging in an activity that might be considered malicious, threatening or constitutes bullying, including but not limited to social media, will be asked to leave this show without compensation and will be banned from any future shows held by this club.

CH and Champion Points

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

**includes the dog awarded Winners*

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge SHALL NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges, with at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GCH and Grand Champion Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GCHEX and Grand Champion Excellent Points

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

Altered Champion and Altered Points

Section 13.8.1 Championship points will be awarded as per Chapter 15, with the exception of 15.1.11. The winner of an Altered Best in Show shall be awarded points according to the total number of dogs in competition following the point schedule in Section 15.1.2.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion [Alt] and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

Conformation Show Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 4.7.1 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Moving Class Dog to Specials Only

Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only," providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the judging of your breed by the owner or handler.

When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the breed judging scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

Moving from Specials Back to the Classes

Section 8.10.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a Special if it has been entered incorrectly, only where the shows have already closed.



HEALTH REMINDERS

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

At events where judges will be checking bites, judges should be encouraged to have the exhibitors show the bite. If the judge insists on checking bites themselves, they are expected to use hand sanitizer or soap and water in between each exhibit. Please ensure that sanitizer wipes and bottles of hand sanitizer are available at all times at events.

CORRECTING SHOW RESULTS

Section 9.9 The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than **90 DAYS** following the date(s) of the event(s).



ZERO TOLERANCE – Any individual initiating bullying tactics at the Ontario Breeders Association Events will be asked to leave the Event grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds). A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit.

Definition of Bullying: Refers to a range of behaviors in which targeted individuals are repeatedly, and over time, treated in a mean, insulting or abusive way. Bullying can be initiated deliberately or unconsciously. The affected person may feel upset, afraid, isolated, or humiliated. The bully sometimes acts alone and sometimes as part of a group of people.

Examples include:

- *insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits*
- *spreading false or malicious rumors, gossip, or innuendo*
- *berating/belittling an individual*
- *unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others*
- *giving insulting Nicknames*
- *engaging in practical jokes that humiliate*
- *undermining or deliberately impeding a person's work*
- *physical gesturing that intimidates, offends, degrades, or humiliates*
- *mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms*
- *yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces, or belittles*
