Ms. Wendy Hamilton-Petkau

Wendy bred her first litter of Golden Retrievers in 1982 and is still involved with the breed today. Her accomplishments with the breed is Top winning dogs in Canada with #1 Golden 2020, as well as winning the US Golden National in 2023 with 3 of her dogs under 3 judges. Initially Wendy was only interested in Conformation, but after meeting her husband Keith, they commenced teaching obedience & agility, and competed in same. She still teaches conformation handling classes for all breeds at their facility Auburnmist Training Centre Inc.



Ms. Margaret Jones

I am a retired Health Care Administrator who has been showing and training dogs since 1965, when I obtained my first Irish setter. Since then I have shared my home with Irish Setters, Cairn Terriers, Boxers and a number of different breeds including, Doberman Pinschers, a Great Dane, Afghan Hound and a Tibetan Mastiff.

As a small breeding kennel we raised and bred Irish Setters, Boxers and Cairn Terriers under the Kian Prefix and exhibited them to Group, Specialty and Best in Show wins. We gained top Dog Awards and many Obedience titles with our

Irish Setters and Boxers. Cairn terriers do not excel in the Obedience ring but they love to work at Rally, Scent detection and Earth sports.



Mr. Richard Lopachuk

A retired Government of Canada employee for 35 years and is recently retired from his own business as a Water Management Consultant which spanned another 23 years. Started in purebred dogs in 1966 with German Shepherd Dogs in the obedience ring and graduated to conformation a year later. Over the next 59 years bred many champion German Shepherd Dogs, Miniature Schnauzers, Cairn Terriers and Papillons. Also bred and exhibited Wire Fox Terriers and Pointers. Richard, along with his wife Nancy still breed and exhibit Papillons. Richard is a Life Member of the Canadian Kennel Club and was on the Board of Directors of the CKC for 14 years, retiring from the Board in 2002, and re-appointed to the Board for 2016-17. Started judging in 1989 with the Terrier Group and was an All-Breed Judge in Canada, retiring in 2022. He has also judged internationally in Australia, BIS Melbourne Royal, 2005, Argentina,

Brazil, Chile, China, Columbia, India, Indonesia, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Philippines, South Africa, Sweden, Thailand and the United States.



Mr. Patrick Mudge

Patrick purchased his first purebred dog (a Samoyed) in 1969, which sparked an obsession with all things related to the dog show world. As a teenager he spent as much time as possible at shows lurking around the handlers' setups waiting for an opportunity to take in that second-place dog for Reserve! An early fascination with the Winterfold whippets of Martine Collings led to a lifetime of involvement with that wonderful breed. Since that time Patrick has owned several different breeds and has shown dogs (many owned by others) to group first in six of the 7 groups (all but herding) and to Best in Show. His most recent involvement (since 1997) has been with miniature poodles, co-owning Canada's Puppy of the Year for 1997 (BIS Can.Am/Ch Minstrel der Letzte Tanz, "Swayze") #1 mini and #4 non-sporting dog for 1998 and #2 sire in the breed. Patrick has bred Group winning, BPIS and BISS winning mini poodles. A music educator by profession, teaching piano and voice, he has recently retired, with his partner Walter, to a small (266 acre) farm outside of Fredericton, NB.



Ms. Lynda Saranchuk





Mel and Lynda have been showing and breeding English Setters since 1974, under the Hysteppin Permanently Reg. kennel name. We have bred numerous Canadian and American Champions. We were founding members of the Chautauqua Kennel Club and were involved in all aspects of that club including President, Treasurer and Show Secretary. Although English Setters were our first love and always will be, we also have shown Labs, GSP's, Sibes, Irish Wolfhounds and English Cockers.

Lynda owned a very successful grooming operation which rose to a level of several groomers. We have both judged in all provinces of Canada, several states in the U.S., Argentina, Bermuda, Colombia, China, New Zealand and Australia. We have had the honour of judging many specialties in several countries. The English Setter Specialty of Southern California was definitely a highlight for both of us. Mel is looking forward to judging the Irish Setter Club of Washington this year as well as the Setter Specialty in Melbourne Australia in December.



Mr. Gary Stiles

I have trained and shown dogs for over 45 Years. Now, as an AKC Judge I get to embrace my great love of the sport, the people and the dogs in a new platform. I am also licensed to Judge Juniors, which I thoroughly enjoy. I have shown most of the Breeds comprising the Toy group at some point in my career and have a great fondness for the Toys, and particularly Chihuahuas. I became licensed to judge Chihuahuas in 2017 and now have my regular judging status for the entire Toy Group. I have shown, bred, loved and been owned by Chihuahuas since 1992.



Dr. Terill Udenberg

Dr. Udenberg has been involved in the sport of exhibiting dogs for nearly thirty years, starting with Dobermans. After a short hiatus, he returned with Standard Poodles and eventually including toy Poodles. He has been breeding Standard Poodles for over thirty years with the prefix "Tees". Dr Udenberg has had multiple Best In Show, and Best In Specialty winners including several top 10 dogs, but his love is, exhibiting the young specimens of his breed. In 2017, the top three young standard poodles in Canada were all from the TEES, and more recently the pedigrees of some of the top winning dogs at Poodle Club of America, and regional specialties. Dr. Udenberg has judged in Canada, USA, and Australia and New Zealand, China, Thailand, Philippines, Ecuador, Denmark and Columbia,

and frequently does seminars in several subjects including, "The Physics of Balance- a Scientific Approach", Canine Reproduction, and Brachycephalic Obstructive Airway.



Mr. Raymond Yurick

Raymond grew up in the sport of pure bred dogs and Dog Shows. My family bred Great Pyrenees. I was a junior handler, an assistant for respected Top Canadian Handlers . After many years of their tutelage I set off on my own professional handling career, with great success. As an All Breed Professional Handler on both sides of the border , I am proud to have won numerous Best in Shows and National Specialties with breeds in all 7 groups. Note: There will be no refunds for duplicate entries or overpayment of fees. It is the owner of the dog entered that is responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Please review email confirmations so corrections may be made **prior to closing date** to avoid disappointment.

- 8.6.1 The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause
- 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge wither directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.
- 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Exhibitors, handlers, judges and assistants are expected to participate with honesty, fairness and integrity, ever mindful of the practice of "good sportsmanship", before, during and after the WKKC show. Any person engaging in an activity that might be considered malicious, threatening or constitutes bullying, including but not limited to social media, will be asked to leave the show without compensation and will be banned from any future WKKC events.

A service charge of 10% will be assessed. This includes entries sent online or post using a credit card or interac for payment.

ALL Entries **MUST** be received by closing date: WEDNESDAY, JULY 30th, 2025 @9:00pm Pacific Time

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE BREED JUDGING ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. TCN Fees WILL NOT be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

BRACE -This class is for 2 dogs on one lead. They need not be the same owner.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Pee Wees do not compete for best overall. Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only at this group specialty. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior.

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available: online at www.ckc.ca

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level. In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- © Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.
- 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GchEx) (48-06-12)
- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.
- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- © a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.
- 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.
- 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

<u>AGREEMENT</u>

Payment and acceptance of entries shall indicate acceptance of such.

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold West Kootenay Kennel Club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by

disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
