Since then he has had the pleasure of judging in every show around the country in Thailand, Canada, Peru, New Zealand, Australia, China, Taiwan, India, Philippines, Malaysia, Vietnam, Myanmar, Korea, Japan, South Africa, Russia and Latvia. In addition to breeding, training, exhibiting and judging, he has been an active columnist in popular pet magazine and business newspapers. He is currently the Executive Consultant in Human Resources Development. He was awarded The Best Consultant of the Year 2015 from The Thai Ministry of Industry and Role Model Award 2016 in Business and Organizational Development from General Phichit Kullawanich, Privy Councilor.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

# **BORDER CROSSING**

A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada.

# **CONFORMATION CLASSES**

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A TCN dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE BREED JUDGING ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED.

# **NON-REGULAR CLASSES**

BABY PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

BRACE (Saturday Only) - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

VETERANS CLASS (Saturday Only) - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

# **UNOFFICIAL CLASS**

BREEDER/OWNER/HANDLER (Friday Only) - This class is for breeder/owner/handler. You must be entered in a Regular Class to be eligible and handle the dog at all levels to be eligible for BOH in Breed, BOH in Group and BOH in Show. There is no entry fee but you must enter this class separately online or check the box on the entry form provided for mailed in entries. No exceptions.

# **SEXUALLY ALTERED**

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASS (Saturday Only) - This class is for dogs which have been spayed or neutered.

# **OBEDIENCE CLASSES (Friday, Saturday and Sunday PM)**

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Open "A" and Open "B" at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

**PRE-NOVICE** - The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of P.C.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of C.D. may enter the Pre-Novice class.

**NOVICE A** - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of C.D. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a C.D.X. title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

**NOVICE B** - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of C.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

**NOVICE C** - The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title C.D. or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

**NOVICE INTERMEDIATE** - The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class and earning this title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a C.D. or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle the dog in all 6 exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

**OPEN HA** - The Open HA class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. but has not earned the title of C.D.X. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a U.D. title may not handle a dog in this class.

**Open18A** -The requirements are the same as Open HA and the same rules except the Long Sit is replaced with Change of Positions Exercises and the Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

**OPEN HB** - The Open HB class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. Dogs which have earned the title of C.D.X. or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

**Open 18B** – The requirements are the same as Open HB and the same rules except the addition of the new Change of Positions Exercises and Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

**UTILITY A** - The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D.X. but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a M.O.T.Ch. title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

**UTILITY B** - The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D.X. or U.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

# RALLY CLASSES (Friday, Saturday and Sunday AM)

No dog may be entered in both Advanced "A" and Advanced "B" at the same trial or Excellent "A" and Excellent "B" at the same trial.

**RALLY NOVICE A** - Dogs competing in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice (R.N.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification form the CKC that the dog has won the title.

**RALLY NOVICE B** - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**RALLY INTERMEDIATE** - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

**RALLY ADVANCED B** - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**RALLY EXCELLENT A** - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this case must be the owner, the co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class, A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class .However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

**RALLY EXCELLENT B** - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class, A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honor Exercise. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**RALLY MASTER** - This class is for dogs that have earned the RE title. Any person may handle the dog in this class. Dogs must earn 3 qualifying scores of 85 points or more under at least 2 different judges.

# **GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS**

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from: The CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9 or online at www.ckc.ca

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

# **HERITAGE PARK FIRE SAFETY RULES:**

Extension cord may not be stretched across fire lanes.

Tape of any kind is not to be used on the floors.

# All power cords must be unplugged at night.

Aisles must be kept open at all times to allow everyone easy and speedy exit in case of emergency.

All designated FIRE LANES must be kept clear at all times or vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

# **ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:**

# Only dogs entered will be allowed in the building.

# Grooming area is for dogs entered only.

Breeds cannot be judged out of order.

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or venders/concessions. The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

Delays waiting for dogs are not possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their dogs "conflict".

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors grooming space.

# Plastic sheeting must be under all ex-pens.

Any tape used in the building has to be easily removable and must be removed after the show is completed. Coloured tape/duct tape and/or Gorialla Tape is not allowed. You must leave your setup in the same clean condition you found it in when you first arrived at the show. Unless permission is granted in writing by the Mount Cheam Canine Association, there will not be any handling classes operated or offered by anyone in any part of the Heritage Park facility at any time.

# Power bars are not permitted as they will blow fuses.

No paper from under the ex-pens or crates or liquid waste are to be disposed of in garbage cans. They must go in the bins provided outside the building. Anyone putting any dog papers or waste into garbage containers on floor one will not be permitted to enter future shows as Heritage Park may refuse to have dog events if this continues.

# CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (\*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.
- 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)
- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.
- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.
- 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.
- 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
