Classifications

The following classes (divided by sex) are offered:

Junior Puppy, Senior Puppy, 12 – 18 Months, Bred By, Canadian Bred, Open, Specials

Plus

Veterans Class For dogs seven (7) years of age and over on the day of the show. (Dogs entered in this class may be neutered/spayed) Classes further divided by age (<11 and 11 >).

Best Veteran Male & Female will compete for Breed. Best Veteran in each breed will compete for Best Veteran in Specialty.

Altered Classes All dogs over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure.

Baby Puppy Class Dogs 4-6 months of age

Veteran Sweeps

Classes (divided by sex) are: 7 & under 11 years, and 11 and over.

All dogs must be entered in the Specialty or in Exhibition Only; Dogs may be neutered/spayed.

Prizes: Trophy & Rosette for Best In Sweeps; Rosette for Best of Opposite in Sweeps

1st in each class – 30% of entries for that class; 2nd in class – 20% of entries for that class

 3^{rd} in each class – 15% of entries for that class; 4^{th} in class – 10% of entries for that class

(25% to be retained by the Club)

Junior Handling

A special Junior Handling Competition will be held in conjunction with the Specialty. Junior Show Handling rules apply. All dogs handled must be entered in the Specialty Show in one of the official classes or for Exhibition Only. It must be indicated on the dog's entry that it is being used in Jr Handling, the handler and their class.

Non-Regular Classes & Awards

The Baby Puppy Class is for dogs 4 months and under 6 months on the day of the show. Dogs entered in the Baby Puppy Class do not compete for points. Puppies entered in this class will participate & compete for Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Specialty. There is no listing fee for unregistered baby puppies.

NOWDA is pleased to offer the non-regular class of BRACE. Judging will take place immediately after breed and group judging. Dogs must be entered in a regular class or exhibition only. Dogs may be neutered/spayed. A Brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead. Ownership does NOT have to be identical!!!!!

Cash prizes:

A Rosette, prize and cash are offered for the following: Group 1st \$75, Group 2nd \$50, Group 3rd \$40 and Group 4th \$30. Best Veteran in Specialty \$25, Best Puppy in Specialty will receive a Rosette and a prize. Rosettes only for Group 1st (Altered), Best Brace in Specialty, Best Baby Puppy in Specialty; Ribbons for Best of Breed, Best Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Breed and Best of Breed (Altered). Rosette and prize for Best Overall Jr Handler

Temporary Competition Numbers: Self-serve Online Registration for Listed Dogs

With the implementation of CKC's IT system, a new process requires all owners of unregistered, recognized breeds entering events to obtain a *Temporary Competition Number* (TCN). TCNs will replace the current system of entering events with "listed dogs", and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event and the same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a (Performance Event Number) PEN or (Canine Companion Number) CCN.

While there is no fee to obtain a TCN, exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called *listing fees*) when entering events using this number.

The process of obtaining a TCN will be self-serve; exhibitors will be directed to the CKC website to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly upon completion.

Exhibitors may also obtain a TCN by completing a printed application and submitting it to the CKC via mail, or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division by telephone.

Until March 2, 2020 dogs may still be entered into CKC events without a registration number or ERN by marking "TCN" on the entry form (or "Listed" if it is an old entry form). However, an e-mail address will be required. Before you apply for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if CKC has already created a TCN for them. There will be a tab for TCN Dogs on the Owner's Portal account.

Please note that if your dog does not have a registration number or ERN, and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores, or awards, there is no need to apply for a TCN. CKC records will be updated accordingly.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars ONLY. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal Cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as they will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

Chapter 15: Champions and Championship Points

Section 1. A dog awarded Winners at a Conformation Show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

* Includes the dog awarded Winners

Section 15.1.8. In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level a dog awarded WINNERS which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that the dog has defeated another dog at the group level,

A class dog awarded Best In Show at a championship show will be credited five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at any single show.

Effective January 1, 2012 to read as follows: In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall <u>NOT</u> be included in the calculation for championship points In addition to the 10 point/3 judges rule: "In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion....the dog must.....have earned at least one 2- point win either at the breed or group level".
