

Due to inconsistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". The banks will not clear them. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

All entries must contain complete information as required by the CKC rules. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee, in full, and all listing fees where applicable. A listing fee as established by the CKC must accompany the entry of a dog for which a CKC individual registration number is not shown on the entry form or ERN notice.

NOTICE TO ALL FOREIGN EXHIBITORS - ERN NUMBERS

All foreign born and foreign owned dogs who enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events do not require a CKC registration number but will require an ERN (Event Registration Number). To obtain an ERN, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with cheque or VISA/Mastercard number (expiry date, cardholder's name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of ERN to you. The cost is \$64.07. Dog may initially be entered as listed but the ERN must be applied for within 30 days of winning CKC points, awards, or scores to avoid cancellation. GENERAL INFORMATION

- ENTRY FEES SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Trial Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the Club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made. Overpayments will not be refunded.
- ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED WHEN A BITCH ENTERED IN OBEDIENCE COMES INTO SEASON after entry of the bitch has been submitted if a Veterinarian's certificate, (certifying that the bitch was in season within the ten-day period preceding the trial), is delivered to the Trial Secretary on or before the date of the trial.
- Entries must be typewritten or clearly printed. Owners are responsible for errors on entry forms. Cal K-9 Obedience Club of Calgary does not assume any responsibility for incorrect information or errors due to illegibility of information on any entry form.
- Make cheques payable to Cal K- 9 Obedience Club of Calgary. No post-dated cheques will be accepted.
- ENTRIES WILL BE ACKNOWLEDGED AT THE TIME OF ACCEPTANCE AS WELL AFTER CLOSING DATE. Receipts and judging schedule will be emailed. Please ensure email address is printed on your entry form. Armband numbers will be available one hour before the trials begin. There will be no catalogue printed, but a judge's schedule / running order list will be provided.
- Due to the restrictions of an indoor trial, the "Exhibition Only" class WILL NOT be provided.
- (Chapter 3, Section 3.6.1 CKC Obedience Trial Rules & Regulations). "A judge officiating at a trial held under these Rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the trial. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the trial to see that this rule is effectively carried out."
- ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES. If not in competition, the dog must wear a collar and be on a leash a maximum length of six (6) feet or appropriately confined in the benching area. There will be 2 rings, and VERY LIMITED benching space.
- Dogs must be exercised in designated areas ONLY.
- All empty rings are to be kept free of dogs.
- An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry. This Notice of Withdrawal must be in writing and received by the Show Secretary on or before the official closing date and time as published in the Premium List.
- In Transit permits will NOT be available from the trial secretary if needed. DOGS NOT ENTERED IN THE TRIALS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED IN THE BUILDING.
- All Miscellaneous Class Dogs who do not have a Certification Number can only compete at the Novice level in Obedience Trials and must pay a listing fee of \$10.50. Those dogs with a certification number may proceed through all levels. Titles will only be awarded to those dogs that have been certified.
- Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregistrable dog of a CKC recognized breed to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. For more information regarding applying for a PEN visit <u>www.ckc.ca</u>.
- Cal K-9 Obedience Club of Calgary, its members and volunteers will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, BUT will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- The Trial Superintendent has the authority to expel any dogs deemed to be a danger to other dogs or people. There will be no refund for dogs that are expelled.

OFFICIAL CLASSES

Pre Novice – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has not earned the title of P.C.D (Pre-Companion Dog). Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercise. A dog that has earned the title of C.D. is not eligible for this class. This class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

Novice A – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has not earned the title of C.D. (Companion Dog). Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The dog must be handled by the owner or a member of his immediate family. No person who has previously trained or exhibited a dog through its C.D.X. (Companion Dog Excellent) title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

Novice B – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has not earned the title of C.D. (Companion Dog). Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the group exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Novice A and Novice B class at any one trial.

Novice C – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of C.D., C.D.X., U.D., or any Obedience Trial Championship Title prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the group exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice C class indefinitely. Scores earned by dog in the Novice C Class are not eligible for High in Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Novice Intermediate – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of C.D., C.D.X., U.D., or any Obedience Trial Championship. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. This class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes.

Open HA / 18A – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of C.D. but has not earned the title of C.D.X. (Companion Dog Excellent). Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The dog must be handled by the owner or a member of his immediate family. Any person who has previously trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a U.D. title may not handle a dog in this class.

Open HB / **18B** – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of C.D. in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the group exercises. No dog may be entered in both Open HA/18A and Open HB/18B at any one trial. A dog that has earned the title of C.D.X. must compete in Open B. Dogs eligible for entry in the Utility Class are also eligible for entry in this class.

Utility A – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed that has earned the title of C.D.X., but has not earned the title of U.D. The dog must be handled by the owner or a member of his immediate family. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a

M.O.T.C.H title may not handle dogs in this class. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class.

Utility B – This is for any dog of any recognized or listed breed that has earned the title of C.D.X. or U.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Utility A and Utility B at the same trial.

Cal K-9 Obedience Club of Calgary/Kayenna Training Academy COVID-19 Requirements

Due to ongoing concerns with the coronavirus disease, we are asking for your cooperation to limit the possible spread of the disease and ensure an environment that is safe and comfortable for all participants.

Please do not participate if you answer "Yes" to any of the following in the 14 days prior to the trial:

- Have you experienced any fever, cough or have difficulty breathing?
- Have you returned from the U.S. or other international destinations?
- Have you been contact traced to a COVID-19 case?
- Have you had contact with a compromised person who has been outside Canada?

General Required Practices

- 1. Cal K-9 members, judges and exhibitors are required to follow Federal, Provincial, Local and facility guidelines as presented below. Any changes in guidelines between the posting of this Premium List and the starting of each trial will also be followed.
- 2. Each judge, trial superintendent and trial chairperson have flexibility in making sure the policies are adhered too, and timing of events is at their discretion. Some exhibitors may feel that we are too strict and other may share the opposite reaction that we are not strict enough. We are hoping to err on the side of safety without interfering in the spirit of the competitions.
- 3. The building limit for public events will be adhered too, and exhibitors will be requested to return to their vehicle and/or depart when their classes are completed.
- 4. Social distancing must be practiced. Maintain a distance of 6 feet / 2 Metres or more unless individuals are part of a "your bubble".
- 5. Masks are mandatory unless you are in the ring running a dog in a class. Masks are to be supplied by exhibitors for their personal use. Masks are required in all common areas where social distancing is not guaranteed.
- 6. Exhibitors may consider wearing disposable or washable gloves unless running a dog in a class.
- 7. There will be plenty of hand sanitizer around the facility for personal use.
- 8. Wash hands as frequently as possible.
- 9. No handshakes or hugging.
- 10. Do not touch dogs that are not your own.
- 11. Bring your own pen/pencil. No common use pencils, pens or markers will be available.
- 12. Benching spaces must be at least 6 feet / 2 Metres apart. The benching space should be used for each exhibitor only. Leave your belongings at your own risk, there will be no security on site. Dogs are not to be left in the building overnight. You may bench your dogs in your vehicle if you wish ensuring you bring proper shade/heat, ventilation, and water for your dogs. Dogs in vehicles will be monitored and dealt with appropriately if they are deemed to be in distress.
- 13. TO FACILITATE SOCIAL DISTANCING, NO SPECTATORS WILL BE ALLOWED AT THIS TRIAL DUE TO THE RESTRICTIONS.
- 14. Move-ups are not permitted. Day of trial entries are not permitted.

Information applicable to all participants

- 1. The trial has been limited to **50** humans at the venue at any one time. The **50** human limit applies to entrants, judges, Cal K-9 members and all person's present. There will no spectators allowed at this trial due to the restrictions.
- 2. There will be no printed catalogue. A judges schedule / running order will be emailed to all participants and a few will be provided the day of the trial.
- 3. Score sheets will not be given out to competitors in the ring, but the club may pass the scoresheet information on to the competitors electronically or some other 'touch free' means.
- 4. There will be a self-serve ribbon table. Exhibitors may pick up their own ribbons once rounds are completed. Please only touch what you are taking and be sure to maintain social distancing.
- 5. The trial secretary's designated space will be considered sacred ground. Barriers will be set up using a 6 Feet / 2 Metre perimeter to protect the trial secretary. Anyone who violates the space of the trial secretary will be asked to leave the trial grounds and may not return for the duration of the trials. No refunds for entries will be provided in this instance.
- 6. Group stays dogs will be placed a minimum of 8 feet apart at all levels. A dog who fails to qualify any of the individual exercises is not eligible to compete in the group exercises.
- 7. Tall chairs will be used for the figure 8 posts at all levels.
- 8. Indoor shoes will be mandatory from the time you enter the building until you leave.

Trial Practices

- 1. Each exhibitor will provide a completed executed waiver of liability for Cal K-9 and Kayenna Training Academy. Waivers will be given to the trial secretary as part of your entry package before the first morning of the trials. No one will be allowed to participate who has not completed the required waiver. Waivers WILL NOT be available at the show.
- 2. Anyone exhibiting COVID symptoms will be asked to leave the trial grounds and will not be allowed to return. No refund will be issued.
- 3. Please carefully read the CKC's recommended COVID obedience protocols document carefully. There have been some temporary rule changes that will most likely affect you!
- 4. It will be mandatory that all exhibitors wear a mask except when running a dog in a class.
- 5. The gate board will be available near the rings for exhibitors to indicate they are present and running in the class. DO NOT TOUCH THE BOARD. A steward will mark you as present and make any run order changes that are needed. A 6 Feet / 2 Metre buffer will be marked around the gate steward.
- 6. Exhibitors will remove and retrieve their own leashes. A chair or other object will be placed in the ring for the leash.
- 7. MAINTAIN 6 Feet / 2 Metre SPACING at all times.
- 8. Equipment will be sanitized at the end of each day and if/when stewards are changed.

COVID19 Obedience and Rally Rules General Guidelines

Clubs will follow all Federal, provincial and local health rules when holding a trial and the protocol will be detailed in the Premium List. Judges, officials, and handlers will abide by the rules specified.

The following are allowable temporary changes to the Obedience rules and regulations that a club may opt to use during their event while operation under COVID restrictions. However, any other changes to any other rule not mentioned here will not be allowed.

- Judges may wear a mask even if not required by the club,
- The chair or table where the leash and other equipment is to be placed should be located at a convenient place determined by the judge but can be located in the ring or if not appropriate, just outside of the ring such that the handler can obtain the item without leaving the ring,
- If a chair or table or any other surface is used to hold leashes, dumbbells, gloves or any other equipment owned by the handler, that surface must be sanitized immediately after use. Paper can be placed on the surface if sanitizing is not done but that paper must be removed immediately after use, disposed of appropriately and replaced ready for the next exhibitor,
- If a re-throw of the dumbbell is required, the handler should be allowed to ask the dog to stay and the handler will go and pick up the dumbbell and return to where the dog was left. If the dog moves during this process, it will not be judged unless it is out of control,
- For the article exercise in Utility, the handler can retrieve the articles to be scented from the article bag and put them on the 'article' chair,
- Score sheets should not be given out to competitors in the ring, but the club may pass the scoresheet information on to the competitors electronically or some other 'touch free' means,
- The exhibitor may either leave the dog on a sit stay or heel with the dog to the location of the chair to both obtain and return their leash and articles used during the exercises, and
- It is recommended that the club publish either in the premium list or judging schedule or both, the modified rules that it is adopting for their event.

Assumption of the Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/ COVID-19

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. **COVID-19 is extremely contagious** and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As a result, Federal, Provincial and Local governments and Federal / Provincial health agencies recommend social distancing and have, in many locations, imposed restrictions on the congregation of groups of people.

The CAL K-9 OBEDIENCE CLUB OF CALGARY (CAL K-9) and Kayenna Training Academy have put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19; however, CAL K-9/Kayenna Training Academy cannot guarantee that you or your guests or children will not become infected with COVID-19. Further, attending an indoor Obedience event could increase your risk and the risk of your guests and your children's risk of contracting COVID-19.

By signing this agreement, I acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume the risk that I, my guests, and/or my children may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 by attending the CAL K-9 Obedience trials at Kayenna Training Academy and that each exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and death. I understand that the risk of becoming exposed to or infected by COVID-19 at the Cal K-9 Obedience trials may result from the actions, omissions, or negligence of myself and others, including, but not limited to, Cal K-9 members, volunteers, judges, and participants and their families. I voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks and accept sole responsibility for any injury to my children myself, or any guests (including, but not limited to, personal injury, disability and death), illness, damage, loss, claim, liability, or expense of any kind, that I, my guests or my children may experience or incur in connection with my attendance at the Cal K-9 Obedience trials at Kayenna Training Academy. On my behalf and on behalf of my guests and children, I hereby release, covenant not to sue, discharge, and hold harmless Cal K-9 or Kayenna Training Academy, its members, agents, representatives and volunteers, of and from the Claims, including all liabilities, claims, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of or relating thereto. I understand and agree that this release includes my Claims based on the actions, omissions or negligence of Cal K-9 or Kayenna Training Academy its members, agents, representatives and volunteers, whether a COVID-19 infection occurs before, during or after participation in any Cal K-9 Obedience event at Kayenna Training Academy.

My signature indicates that:

- I/we understand and agree to the above and to abide by all of the Official CKC Rules and Regulations, and any additional Rules or Regulations included in the Official Premium List.

The Obedience Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred."
