This is a team event; each team must consist of 1 dog and 2 handlers

**Owners may enter a maximum of two dogs for each test.
Additional dogs may be put on the waitlist.**

Test equipment will be a battery powered continuous loop or drag machine.
Electronic timing will be used.

Any individual who abuses or harasses any judge, club official, volunteer or participant at the event or in matters related to the event will be excused from the event and will not be permitted to participate in any future events hosted by the Western Gazehound Club.

ENTRY FEES:

Entry Fees must be received before 7:00pm PDT, June 14 th , 2025 and only online payment through dogshow.ca will be accepted. Dogshow.ca service fees (nonrefundable) are 10% of total fees + GST. Entries will not be changed and no refunds issued after this time except as specified in the “ REFUND ” section below and according to the COVID-19 protocols.

WAIVERS: The online waiver for the year 2025 **MUST** be completed online before 7:00pm PDT, June 21st, or the entry will not be approved.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND TEST RULES

ELIGIBILITY: Purebred or mixed-breed dogs must be at least 12 months of age that:

- (a) Are individually registered with the CKC (have a CKC registration number),
- (b) Have an Event Registration Number (ERN),
- (c) Have a Performance Event Number (PEN),
- (d) Are eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- (e) Have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed
- (f) Have a Canine Companion number (CCN) if it is a mixed-breed

Day of test entries will NOT be accepted at this test. If the tests fill, a waitlist will be kept and dogs from the waitlist may be entered and added by the Sprinter Test Secretary.

NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE: CKC has a tracking fee for non-members. Please refer to the information about this policy on the CKC website:

INSPECTION: Inspection starts 15 minutes before your flight starts. It ends 5 minutes before your flight starts. **Dogs not present at inspection shall be scratched with no refunds** except in the case of some unforeseen circumstance and the event secretary has been notified. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

All dogs will be inspected for fitness prior to being allowed to run. Bitches will be checked to determine if they are in season. **Bitches in season will not be allowed to run.**

ALL HANDLERS BRIEFING: An all handlers briefing is held 5 minutes before the start of your flight. **ALL** handlers are expected to attend.

REFUNDS: Sprinter is an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. Your dog relies on you to ensure this. Dogs that are injured prior to the test or deemed unfit to compete at inspection and bitches in season will be issued a refund (less applicable dogshow.ca fees)

DOGS UNDER CONTROL: All dogs must be under control, on a leash except when running the test. Dogs are expected to be in high arousal and excited in the presence of the lure. Handlers must be able to control their dogs for everyone's safety. If they do not, they shall be refunded their entry and not allowed to run. Additionally, the Sprinter Committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs from the event site.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS: Muzzles and catch collars may be used at the handler's discretion. **Handlers are not allowed to wear open-toed shoes on the course. Flexi leads will not be allowed on the test site.**

YOUR TEAM: CKC rules state that *"It is recommended that an owner or someone familiar with the dog stand at the finish in order to catch the dog once the course has been completed."*

We would like to reinforce this recommendation. The 'catcher' should be someone the dog is excited to run to, while the 'releaser' can be anyone with the skill and strength to hold the dog until released. **If you are entering multiple dogs, it is recommended you bring a second handler with you. Volunteers are limited; however, if you need help releasing your dog(s), please let us know upon arrival.**

OWNER RESPONSIBILITY: The owner of the dog entered in this event is entirely responsible for any error in the entering of their dog, regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made. Overpayments and duplicate entries will be considered a donation to our ribbon fund. Thank you!

WITHDRAWAL OF ENTRIES: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. Written or electronic notification must be received by the Sprinter Test Secretary no later than the official closing time and date. If written notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the event. Dogshow.ca fees will not be refunded.

TEST SITE: Bring water, shade and shelter for you and your dogs. These tests will run rain or shine. Clean up after yourself and your dog. A bathroom is available. Food is not available on site.

ACCOMMODATION OF A DISABILITY: We welcome all exhibitors and spectators, including persons with disabilities. If you require accommodation of a disability, please make your accommodation known to the club in advance. Please contact the Sprinter Test Secretary to ensure we can do our best to accommodate your needs.

REGULATIONS: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. CKC Regulation: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Field Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

The test will follow a Sprint & Go format. Dogs will run once during each test. Two tests will run concurrently in each flight, i.e., all dogs in a flight will run once, in order, for Test 1. They will run again in the same flight in order for Test 2. Handlers will then leave the site to make room for the next flight.

Please note that the club **will no longer be accepting flight preferences from handlers** prior to the running order being distributed. Managing individual requests created significant logistical challenges and took up considerable time. We appreciate your understanding as we streamline this process.

That said, we do want to support and encourage participation from Vancouver Island exhibitors. Handlers traveling via ferry will typically be assigned a later flight on Saturday and an earlier flight on Sunday to help accommodate ferry schedules. If this applies to you, please email the Sprinter Test Secretary at elise.dobie@hotmail.com so we can do our best to accommodate. We understand that ferry travel can be time-consuming and occasionally challenging, and we truly value the effort and commitment it takes to join us from the Island.

EARNING POINTS

The dog's time to complete the 100 meter dash is converted into kilometers per hour (KPH). A handicap system is applied to a dog's KPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:

- (a) 18" or greater - handicap is 1.25
- (b) 12" up to less than 18" - handicap is 1.5
- (c) Below 12" - handicap is 2.0

Points - KPH multiplied by the dog's handicap. For example $20 \text{ KPH} \times 1.5 = 30$ points. Points are rounded to the nearest whole number.

**Please be sure to select the correct height category
If you are unsure of your dog's height please measure your dog**

RESULTS

Results will be sent to all competitors through dogshow.ca

Exhibitors can verify the results sent to them by email, watch for unofficial results to be posted on Canuck Dogs, or review the official results on their CKC portal where dogs are listed.

Effective January 1, 2024, CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date(s) of the event(s).

AWARDS AND TITLES

A qualifying ribbon will be awarded to each dog that achieves a score. A rosette will be awarded to new title holders. At the event site, please ask the Sprinter Test Secretary for your ribbon(s).

The regular Sprinter titles are as follows:

Novice Sprinter (NS) = 150 points

Sprinter (S) = 500 points

Advanced Sprinter (AS) = 1,000 points

Sprinter Excellent (SX) = 1,500 points

SX followed by a number (e.g. SX2) = every additional 500 points

The **VETERAN** Sprinter class is a set of titles for dogs over the age of 7. You must select the Veteran class on your entry form for your dog's points to count toward Veteran titles. If this selection is not made, your dog's points will go towards regular titles, regardless of their age.

The Veteran Sprinter titles are as follows:

Veteran Novice Sprinter (VNS) = 75 points

Veteran Sprinter (VS) = 250 points

Veteran Advanced Sprinter (VAS) = 500 points

Veteran Sprinter Excellent (VSX) = 750 points

VSX followed by a number (e.g. VSX2) = every additional 250 points

WAIVER

The waiver for 2025 MUST be completed online before 7:00pm PDT, June 21st or the entry will not be approved. If you have already completed the waiver for this year, there is no need to do so again.

In consideration of providing the opportunity to attend, practice, participate, compete in and/or be judged in dogs sports including but not limited to lure coursing, coursing and/or chase ability practice and permitting my use of its services, equipment and other facilities as subsequently agreed, and for other goods and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, I, the identified Participant agree and certify as follows:

To hold the Western Gazehound Club including its members, directors, officers and employees (collectively defined as WGC) as well as Lynn Haywood as the owner of this property at 16378 50th Avenue, Surrey, BC on which the event is held, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or things by the act of myself or my dog(s) while in or about the event or practice premises or grounds near the entrance thereto and I assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim.

To hold WGC harmless from any claim for loss of this/these dog(s) by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise and from any claim for damage or injury, even if such loss or damage/injury was caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of WGC or any other person(s).

Assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save WGC harmless from any and all loss and expense, including legal fees, by reason of the liability imposed by law upon WGC for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person(s) including myself, or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my participation in the event, however such injuries, death or property damage may have been caused by the negligence of WGC or any other person(s).

That any cause of action, controversy or claim arising out of or related to the attendance at the event between WGC and myself or as to the construction, interpretation and effect of this waiver shall be settled by arbitration in the province of British Columbia.

That WGC has the right to refuse to allow participation for any cause which WGC will deem sufficient.
