No entry will be accepted without paid entry fees. Tendering of NSF cheques shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by action and cancellation of awards by CKC. A collection fee of \$50.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Please note fees are payable in Canadian dollars. Personal cheques will be accepted however they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you send a check in US Funds, it must be made out in for the full amount of they entry and no exchange will be refunded to exhibitor. Please do not mark the cheques as “Payable in Canadian Funds” or “At Par” as they will not be cleared by the banks. Trophies and rosettes will be awarded for FIRST in each Class (except Pee Wee class, who will receive Participant ribbons or rosettes) and for BEST OVERALL HANDLER and RESERVE BEST OVERALL HANDLER.

IMPORTANT VENUE NOTES

- **LOADING /UNLOADING area - 15 Minutes Maximum**

- The show building will be open Thursday, June 11th AFTER 2 p.m. NO ADMITTANCE will be granted prior to this time. No Exceptions!!!!
- There will be no RV parking before Thursday June 11th at 2 pm, so if you are arriving in town before then you will need to find an alternate site.
- This is a non-smoking facility. The smoking bylaw includes electronic and other smoking devices. There are designated smoking areas outside the building.
- Fire Lanes around the building must be kept open at all times. Please be considerate and think defensively.
- Any vehicle parking in the handicapped designated area must display handicapped permits.
- Venue opens at 7 am Friday, Saturday and Sunday and closes at 7:00 pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Exhibitors must vacate the building one hour after Best in Show on Sunday, June 14th, 2026. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs.
- EXTENSION CORDS: Please tape down cords to ensure safety of others. Remove tape from floor at end of show and clean your area.
- Aisles must be kept open at all times to allow everyone easy and speedy exit in case of emergency.
- Exercise pens MUST have plastic sheeting underneath. If space is limited, exercise pens will have to be taken down during show hours. The Club reserves the right to restrict exhibitors grooming space.
- Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed ONLY and MUST be removed immediately after.
- Exhibitors must exercise their dogs in the designated areas provided. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please do not allow your dogs to urinate on man-made structures (Garbage cans, poles etc.)
- Dogs must be on leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building. Only dogs entered in the show are allowed in the building.
- Dogs will not be allowed to be left in the building overnight
- Showers are available at the Canada Games Centre for a small fee (located just above the show site)

Tourism spots in Whitehorse include the Beringia Centre, Yukon Transportation Museum, Yukon Tourism Centre, MacBride Museum, the S.S. Klondike Paddlewheeler, Shipyards Park, Rotary Park, Whitehorse Rapids Fish Ladder, Miles Canyon, Kwanlin Dun First Nation Cultural Centre and library. The Canada Games Complex offers swimming in their large pool and relaxation in the hot tub, steam room or sauna. There is a shallow pool with slides for children. The Complex has an indoor walking track, a fitness centre, an indoor soccer area, ice skating area and skate rentals and a children's playroom. Come and visit this beautiful centre just a 15 minute walk from the dog show site.

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE FOR EXHIBITORS

Takhini Arena – 345 Range Road is located at the top of Two Mile Hill

- Coming from the **West** (from Alaska) on the Alaska Highway, turn left at the intersection with lights at the corner of Hamilton Blvd and Alaska Highway then take a left at the next set of lights.
- Coming from the **East** (from the Airport) turn left at the intersection with lights at the corner of Hamilton Blvd and Alaska Highway then take a left at the next set of lights.
- Coming from downtown Whitehorse, continue straight up the 2 Mile Hill, through the intersection and turn right at the top of the hill

ATTENTION-FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques “Payable in Canadian funds” or “At Par”. They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBERS

All dogs entered in CKC events that are not CKC registered must have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN) before entering into the event(s). This includes Baby Puppies in Conformation shows.

Please note that Listed Breeds are not eligible for a TCN (effective July 6, 2021, this includes Baby Puppies). Listed Breeds must have a Miscellaneous_Certification Number (MCN) before entering into an event. The Conformation Show Rules will be updated in this regard.

ERN (EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an ERN. This ERN number does not register a dog with the CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign born and foreign owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN, simply do the following: send to CKC, a photocopy of the dog’s registration certificate reflecting current ownership, i.e. AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN number. Payment must be included with the application. Ensure that you provide the CKC with your full return address to enable the ERN number to be sent to you. FAXED requests will be accepted. Please include your VIS A/MasterCard number, expiry date, cardholders name and signature. The ERN number must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as „listed“; however, failure to apply for an ERN number within 30 days of the first event will result in the cancellations of any wins, awards, and scores. PEN (PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER)

To apply for or to obtain, information on the PEN contact the Shows and Trials Division at the Canadian Kennel Club or visit their web site at www.ckc.ca – on line forms

NON CKC MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE – Canadian Residents Only

Effective Jan.1, 2011, the CKC instituted a Non-Member Participation fee for all Canadian Residents who participate in a CKC event, but are not CKC members. To protect Awards/Titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled. This applies to dogs wholly owned by non-members, resident in Canada and does not apply to US exhibitors, nor to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member.

BORDER CROSSINGS (Please make sure you are aware of the requirements for entry into Canada and return to the United States for both you and your dog)

Canada requires proof of current rabies vaccination for all dogs coming into Canada. The date of the rabies vaccine must be at least 30 days prior to entry to Canada. Current information on border crossings can be found here:

CONFORMATION:

The following classes will be provided, divided by sex.

REGULAR CLASSES

JUNIOR PUPPY - 6 months & under 9 months on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY - 9 months & under 12 months on the day of the show

12 – 18 MONTH CLASS - 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED - for dogs born in Canada, Champions in any country excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR - shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

OPEN CLASS - shall be for all dogs.

SPECIALS ONLY - This class will NOT be divided by sex. A dog may be entered for “Specials Only” and such dog shall compete for Best of Breed award. If eligible it must compete for the award of Best of Opposite Sex. All awards the dog earned at the show will be cancelled if, at the time of closing of entries for the show, the dog was not registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club or if the dog has not earned all the championship points required for championship status. The entry of a Listed Dog in this class is NOT allowed.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

VETERAN CLASS - In this optional class for All Breed Shows, dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. The awards for this class are: Best Male Veteran and Best Female Veteran Best Veteran in Breed. Best Veteran in Group Best Veteran in Show. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Breed is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Group. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Group is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Show.

BABY PUPPY CLASS – Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The awards for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group, and Best Baby Puppy in Show

ALTERED CLASS – Altered will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Altered in Group and Best Altered in Show. All dogs must be surgically altered to enter this show.

BRACE CLASS – This class shall be for two dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex)

EXHIBITION ONLY- Dogs entered in this class may not compete in the regular breed classes.



CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 - 5	6 - 9	10 - 12	13 +
Points Awarded	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.

15.1.10 Permission shall be granted to a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group.

15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges; (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN);

(c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

15.1.13 The Board interprets the words “earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges” to mean: (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level; (b) each of the three (3) judge’s awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing; (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Breed or group placing.

As of July 2021, the rules for awarding of Grand Champion and Grand Champion Excellent have changed. Please see CKC Conformation Rule 15.2 Grand Champion (GCH) & 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GCHEx) for details

EXTRACTS FROM CONFORMATION SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

SHOW OFFICIALS - 5.1.6

The officials of a show-giving club will be held responsible for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators during the show. Any person acting in an objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent.

ENTRY FORMS - SECTION 8.2.3

Entry forms received by the CKC that are incomplete and/or contain incorrect information may result in awards being cancelled.

ENTRY FORMS - SECTION 8.2.5

An error in an age-specified class, the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

ENTRIES - SECTION 8.3.1

Every dog entered in a conformation show must be one of the following:

- a. registered with the CKC
- b. have an Event Registration Number
- c. have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN), and must be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d. listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN)

REFUSAL OF ENTRIES – SECTION 8.6.2

A Club may refuse any entry form from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.

DISQUALIFICATIONS – SECTION 14.1.4

Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. (58-06-17) (58-06-17) (13-09-17) 48 A dog disqualified under Section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

INDIGNITIES - SECTION 19.7

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

OBEDIENCE

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Open "A" and Open "B" at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

PRE-NOVICE – The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

NOVICE B - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Novice A and Novice B class at any one trial.

NOVICE C – The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

INTERMEDIATE NOVICE – As per Obedience Trial Rules & Regulations

OPEN A - The Open A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate family. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in these classes, any scores awarded will be cancelled.

OPEN B - The Open B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD. Dogs which have earned the title of CDX or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

UTILITY A – The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

UTILITY B – The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX or OTCH. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

TEAM – The Team class is open to any four (4) dogs that have earned the title of CD or higher. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team or that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed-specialty obedience trial. Five (5) dogs may be entered, one (1) to be considered as an alternate. However, the same four (4) dogs must compete in all exercises. The exercises will be performed simultaneously and judged as specified for the Novice class with the following exceptions: (a) The Figure 8 will be performed as part of the Heel Free exercise. (b) For the Drop on Recall exercise the dogs will first be called and dropped individually, then perform the second portion of the recall and the finish simultaneously. This exercise will be judged as specified for the Open class. Judgment will be based on the performance of the dogs and handlers, plus team precision and coordination. The scoring shall total four (4) times the value of each individual exercise. Each dog receiving a non-qualifying score for an exercise will be automatically scored zero (that is, a full 1/4 off the total score for that exercise for the four dogs). To qualify, a team must have a final score of 680 or more points out of the maximum 800 points and must have earned more than 50% of the available points in each exercise.

BRACE - The Brace class is open to any two (2) dogs that have earned the title of CD or higher. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be the same breed, except when entered in a breed-specialty obedience trial. The owner or any other person may handle a brace in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) brace in this class. The same handler must handle each brace in all seven (7) exercises unless he has two (2) or more braces entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra brace when they are judged together in the group exercises. The Brace class is performed and judged in the same manner as the Novice class. The two (2) dogs shall be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged on the performance of the two (2) dogs as though they were one (1).

RALLY OBEDIENCE

No dog may be entered in both Novice “A” and Novice “B”, Advanced “A” and Advanced “B” at the same trial or Excellent “A” and Excellent “B” at the same trial. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash

RALLY NOVICE A - Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the R. N. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter

this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY NOVICE B - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE - The Rally Intermediate class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter Rally Advanced classes. This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RI or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. Dogs may be entered in this class as a regular entry or changed to it from another official class within the same trial. The request to change must be made on the appropriate CKC form and be submitted to the trial secretary at least 30 minutes before the start of the trial.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title but have not earned the RA title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title or CKC RE title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY ADVANCED B - This class will be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RA title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY EXCELLENT A - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RA title, but have not earned the RE title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title, CKC RM title or CKC RAE title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY EXCELLENT B - This class will be for dogs that have earned the RA title. A dog completing the RE title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class.

RALLY MASTER - This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.E. TITLE . A dog completing the R.M. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class.. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

RALLY BRACE – The brace class is open to any two dogs that have earned the title of RN or higher. The same person does not have to own both dogs. The owner or any other handler may handle a brace in this class. The two dogs will be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged on the performance as if the two dogs were one and will not include jumps.

RALLY TEAM – The team class is open to any four dogs that have earned the title of RN or higher. It is not necessary for the same person to own all dogs in the team or that they be the same breed. Each team member will run the course individually one right after the other. Time will start when the judge says forward and end when the last team crosses the finish line. Jump height will be based on the height of the smallest dog on the team.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. The Club has a zero tolerance of abuse of any description involving any person involved with these shows, including spectators.. Anyone found to be violating this rule will be excused from the show and venue and all events held in conjunction with no refund of fees. A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit, including but not limited to suspension from attending the event for a specific period of time in the future or permanently.
3. The Yukon Kennel Club will use due care & diligence to ensure the welfare and safety of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to dogs, exhibitors, vendors or spectators.
4. The welfare of children is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. Please exercise control and restraint over the children in your care while on the show precincts.
5. The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and equipment left at the show grounds.
6. All entries must be complete, including the full name & address of the owner of the dog. The Club reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs, regardless of how and by whom entries were made. Changes or cancellations after closing date are prohibited except according to CKC rules.
7. A judging schedule will be distributed as soon as possible after entries close, by email if one provided, by postal mail if requested and posted on the Club website: www.dogshow.ca
8. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or Veterinarian for any reason shall not compete in any class for any awards for the balance of the show(s).
9. Dogs must be in the show building at least one hour prior to the judging of their breed. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to have their dog(s) at ringside when required for judging. Dogs not required for further judging may be excused.
10. No refund of entry fee will be made if, because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the Yukon Kennel Club, it is impossible to open or complete the show.
11. All empty rings are to be kept free of dogs one hour before and during the show.
12. No Persons or Dogs shall be allowed in any part of the building not designated for dog show use. Offenders will be asked to leave the grounds.
13. There will be no provision for dogs "In Transit" at this show.
14. All exhibitors, handlers and patrons are expected to know and abide by the CKC Dog Show Rules.
15. The YKC is not responsible for contracts made with any vendors.

SELF CONTAINED RV CAMPING ON SITE

Limited RV parking will be available at Takhini Arena in a designated area cordoned off for that purpose. Access to hydro, septic facilities and water hookups will not be available. This site is on gravel and the erection of tents may be difficult. Please note that half of the parking lot is for public parking only and not available for campers. Sites are first come, first served and exhibitors camp at their own risk. All trailers, recreation units and campers will have buckets underneath for their sink drains. Anyone found discharging wastewater on the ground will be removed from the parking area and will not be entitled to a refund of entry fees.

(All generators must be turned off from 11pm to 6 am NO EXCEPTIONS!!)

No parking will be allowed in the loading area. Off-loading and loading will be allowed for 15 minutes.

ZERO TOLERANCE – Any individual initiating bullying tactics at the Yukon Kennel Club Shows will be asked to leave the show grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds). A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit. Including and not limited to suspension from attending the event for a specific period of time in the future, including permanently.

The RCMP can and will be called to deal with any form of abuse be it verbal or physical altercation or threats of violence against members of the Yukon Kennel Club, Club Volunteers, staff of the Yukon Kennel Club or City of Whitehorse facility staff.

Definition of Bullying: Refers to a range of behaviors in which targeted individuals are repeatedly, and over time, treated in a mean, insulting or abusive way. Bullying can be initiated deliberately or unconsciously. The affected person may feel upset, afraid, isolated, or humiliated. The bully sometimes acts alone and sometimes as part of a group of people.

Examples include:

- *insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits*
- *spreading false or malicious rumors, gossip, or innuendo*
- *berating/belittling an individual • unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others*
- *giving insulting nicknames*
- *engaging in practical jokes that humiliate*
- *undermining or deliberately impeding a person's work*
- *physical gesturing that intimidates, offends, degrades, or humiliates*
- *mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms*
- *yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces, or belittles*
- *intruding on a participant's privacy by pestering, spying or stalking*
- *physically abusing or threatening abuse*
- *criticizing a participant persistently*
- *constantly belittling a person's opinions.*

This applies to interpersonal and electronic communications, such as email, Facebook, text messaging, Twitter and Instagram.

Yukon Kennel Club has a ZERO tolerance of abuse of any description involving any person involved with YKC Shows, including spectators.
