#### **BEST IN SPECIALTY**

#### THE HOLWEIT CHALLENGE TROPHY

A Bronze Study of Ch. Holweit1s Robin The Bank, mounted on an oak base, to be awarded to the Best of Breed Winner at the Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier Association of Canada's National Specialty. The winner will be presented with a Commemorative Study. For permanent possession, the trophy shall be won six times by the same owner, not necessarily with the same dog. The trophy is to remain in the possession of Sylvia and Bill Hamilton or their designate until retired. A small keeper trophy for the Best in Specialty will be provided to the winner.

#### BEST CANADIAN BRED IN SPECIALTY

#### **MAUREEN HOLMES TROPHY**

A 16-inch sterling silver revere bowl, will be awarded to the Best Canadian-bred Wheaten in Specialty. A rosette will also be presented. A donation to the AKC/CHF Health Fund will be made by the donor, Cheryl House in the name of the owner and the dog. For permanent possession, the trophy must be won five times by the same owner, not necessarily with the same dog. The trophy will remain in the possession of Cheryl House or her designate until retired.

# THE TYRONE BEST OF WINNERS TROPHY

A Wheaten bronze mounted on a maple base, to be awarded to the SCWT placed as Best of Winners at the SoftCoated Wheaten Terrier Association of Canada's National Specialty. The winner will be presented with a Commemorative keeper trophy. For permanent possession, the trophy shall be won six times by the same owner. The trophy is to remain in the possession of Lana Campbell and John Slack or their designate until retired.

#### MYSHAWNS WHEATEN AMBASSADOR AWARD

The Myshawns Wheaten Ambassador Award is offered annually by the SCWTAC through the generosity of Margaret Stewardson (Myshawns Wheatens) in Memory of "Shawnie". The award is presented to the Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier from those proposed that best meets the criteria for this award as selected by a committee of three individuals chaired by Margaret Stewardson. The committee will include as a minimum one member of the SCWTAC board. The award will be presented at the AGM/Dinner held in conjunction with the National Specialty.

**Eligibility:** To be considered for this award a Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier must be proposed in writing by a member of the SCWTAC. The proposed dog must also be owned by a SCWTAC member and be registered with the CKC. Proposed candidates will be accepted up to 4 weeks prior to the date of the National Specialty in the year of the award.

Criteria: Dogs from all countries are eligible providing they are registered with the CKC and owned by a member of the SCWTAC. A minimum of 3 titles must have been achieved from different areas of competition (i.e. conformation, obedience, pet therapy, agility, etc.). The level of difficulty of each title will be evaluated and rated accordingly. Involvement in community activities will be a major consideration. To propose a Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier for the current year, submit name of proposed dog and owner along with copies of CKC registration and all titles received and a resume of the dog's accomplishments not to exceed 500 words by the due date to: THE MYSHAWNS WHEATEN AMBASSADOR AWARD

# **ADDITIONAL PRIZES**

During the September 3, 2022 Halifax Kennel Club Rally Obedience and Obedience Trials, a Prize will be given to the Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier attaining the Highest Qualifying score in Rally Obedience and Obedience.

There will also be prizes awarded to any Junior Handler entered in the Halifax Kennel Club Junior Handling Event who handles a Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier.

#### **PUPPY SWEEPSTAKES**

Puppy Sweeps shall be for any dog 6 months up to but not including 18 months of age. To enter this class the dog must be entered in one of the CKC regular classes or in Specials only. There will be three classes in all, divided by sex.

Junior Class for dogs at least 6 months of age up to but not including 9 months. for dogs at least 9 months of age up to but not including 12 months. Senior Class for dogs at least 12 months of age up to but not including 18 months. 12-18 Open

#### VETERANS SWEEPSTAKES

Veterans Sweeps shall be for any dog 7 years of age and up. To enter this class, the dog must be entered in one of the CKC regular classes, Specials or Exhibition Only. There will be two classes in all, divided by sex.

7 up to 10 years for dogs at least 7 years of age up to but not including 10 years

10 years of age and older for dogs 12 years of age and older

The winners of all classes will compete for Best in Sweepstakes. A rosette will be awarded to first place in each class as well as to Best in Sweeps and Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps.

For Puppy and Veterans Sweepstakes the class winners will compete for best in Sweepstakes with the prize money distributed as follows:

15% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best in Sweeps

10% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps

25% will be retained for administrative purposes 50% remaining of the entry fees for a class will go to the class winners

#### **CONFORMATION CLASSES –**

A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show Junior Puppy

# **Unofficial / Non Regular Classes Offered**

Baby Puppy A dog 4 months up to 6 months on the day of the show

**Exhibition Only** Dogs 6 months and over not in competition

Veteran Class Dogs over 7 years of age on day of show. These dogs will compete for regular placements and the winner of this class

will go on to compete for Best of Breed. Dogs competing in the Veteran Class may be spayed/neutered.

Altered

Eligibility for the Sexually Altered Dog Classes shall be limited to dogs over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. This class will be judged immediately after Best Puppy in Breed in the regular specialty classes and after Baby Puppy and Veteran specialty classes if being offered. Male and Female altered classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes. The first place winner from each class will be

awarded Winners Altered Dog/Female who will then compete for Best Altered.

At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs **Brace** 

> of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must

be handled by 1 person on 1 lead

Stud Dog &

Get

This class shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

The stud dog may be spayed/neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be

entered in a Regular class.

**Brood Female &** 

Progeny This class shall have the same requirements as Stud dog and get.

- 1. All entries must be received by the closing date and time, accompanied by the proper entry fees and submitted on an official CKC entry form. Please type or print clearly.
- INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL BE RETURNED. Agents and handlers please note that full name and address of owners 2. MUST be filled in and to whom ID's are to be returned. (Section 13.1.2, Dog Show Rules)
- Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom entries were made. 3.
- To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the Show Secretary after the 4. closing date and time.

5. Only dogs entered may enter these shows. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.

Temporary Competition fees are payable with the Entry Fee for dogs that do not have their individual registration number at closing date. **A Litter registration is not acceptable** 

**Official CKC Entry forms MUST** be used. If other forms are used they must be of the same size and have the <u>information in the same</u> order.

#### NO POST DATED CHEQUES accepted. ALL NSF cheques are subject to a charge of \$20.00.

N.S.F. Cheques are considered Non-Payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. All fees must be paid before the show.

**Attention Foreign exhibitors:** Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At **Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank** drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you

**Refund Policy** - If, because of civil disturbance or riot, extreme weather event, governmental orders, regulations or decree an act of God or any other situations beyond the control of the SOFT-COATED WHEATEN TERRIER ASSOCIATION OF CANADA (other than COVID), it is impossible to open or complete the Shows, no refund of entry fees will be made. If because of Covid cancellation – SOFT-COATED WHEATEN TERRIER ASSOCIATION OF CANADA will refund fees minus any costs incurred by SOFT-COATED WHEATEN TERRIER ASSOCIATION OF CANADA. Please note that Entryline will NOT refund Service Fees.

### ATTENTION ALL CANADIANS WHO ARE NOT CKC MEMBERS

Effective January 1, 2011, the CKC has instituted an annual Non-Member Participation Fee for awards and titles for a CANADIAN non-member of the CKC. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by a non-CKC member and are not applicable to CKC members. Non CKC member participants must either purchase a CKC membership or pay the non-member participation fee within 30 days of notification or the CKC will cancel any awards and titles. # **Event Registration Number (ERN)**

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Events Registration Number (ERN)

To obtain an ERN number simply do the following:

- 1. Send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate reflecting current ownership, for example AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN number.
- 2. Include with the above a cheque or money order in the amount currently required payable to the Canadian Kennel Club.
- 3. Ensure that you provide us with your full return address to enable the ERN number to be sent to you.
- 4. Faxed requests will be accepted. Please indicate your Visa/MasterCard number expiry date, cardholders name and signature. This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as "LISTED", however, failure to apply for an ERN number within 30 days will result in cancellation of any wins, awards or scores. **Temporary Competition Numbers**: Self-serve Online Registration for Listed Dogs Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN. TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number. If your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores or awards, before applying for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if the CKC has already created a TCN for that dog. There will be a tab called TCN Dogs in the owner's Portal account.

**Champions and Championship Points - Chapter 1 SECTION 1 -** A dog awarded Winners at a Championship Show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to the dog awarded winners shall be as provided hereunder:

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an All Breed Championship Show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points won at the Breed or Group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at a single show.

**Grand Champions and GCH Points Section 15.2.1** The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. **15.2.2** Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. **Section 15.2.3** To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Female. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Female). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

#### Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

# Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

**Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)** The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

**GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT AND GCHEX POINTS** The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed). b)three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

**Section 15.3.3** Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The SOFT-COATED WHEATEN TERRIER ASSOCIATION OF CANADA will use all due care and diligence for the safety and welfare of the dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible in the event of an accident to dogs or exhibitors.

- 1. The Superintendent will be in complete charge of these Shows.
- 2. It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. (Section 19.7 Dog Show Rules)
- 3. No person may approach a judge directly or otherwise, orally or in writing to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act. (Section 4.1.6, Dog Show Rules)
- 4. The SOFT- COATED WHEATEN TERRIER ASSOCIATION OF CANADA will not be responsible for any equipment left on the show premises.
- 5. Do Not leave personal belongings at ringside.
- 6. Do Not leave masks, gloves, water bottles, litter, etc behind. Dispose of these items in the garbage bins provided.
- 7. Clean Up after your dogs.

#### **Directions**

**From Halifax**: Take NS-102 to Exit 8A. At the round about, take the first exit, drive to NS Hwy 2, At the roundabout take the first exit. Drive to East Hants Sportsplex 1076 Hwy 2 (on your right)

From New Brunswick or Cape Breton: Take NS-104 to exit 15 (Only exit to Halifax). Take NS-102 to Exit 8A. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit. At the 2nd roundabout, take the first exit, drive to NS Hwy 2. At the roundabout take the first exit. Drive to East Hants Sportsplex 1076 Hwy 2 (on your right)

#### Rules and Guidelines to follow while at the Sportsplex

- •No Ex-Pens are permitted
- •There is to be NO food brought in or consumed within the show premises. All that is allowed in is bottled water.
- It is suggested that all crates have a waterproof covering eg tarpaulin under them. It would go a long way to show our respect for the venue.
- Please exercise your dogs frequently to avoid accidents in the building.
- Bait is permitted but must not be thrown in the rings. This will be strictly enforced.
- For those with a large amount of gear to unload please use the large double doors that are around the back of the building. It will make your job easier.

### **Dog Health Reminders**

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;

Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event); Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.
